



THE AGRICULTURAL MARKETING ACT, 1934

THE DEAD MEAT (IMPORT REGULATION) ORDER, 1940

His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor has made an Order dated the 27th May, 1940, (a copy of which is appended), under the Agricultural Marketing Act, 1934, prohibiting:—

- (1) the importation of fresh, frozen or chilled mutton and lamb into the Isle of Man during the months of June, July and August in any year; and
- (2) the importation of fresh, frozen or chilled beef, veal and pork into the Isle of Man during the months of June, July, August and September in any year; unless accompanied by a licence issued by the Government Secretary or other authorised officer.

The effect of this Order and the Dead Meat (Import Regulation) Orders, 1936 and 1939, is that the importation of fresh, frozen or chilled beef, veal, mutton, lamb and pork into the Isle of Man throughout the whole year is now prohibited except under licence.

The Dead Meat (Import Regulation) Order, 1940

WHEREAS the Lieutenant Governor, acting in pursuance of the powers vested in him by section 25 of the Agricultural Marketing Act, 1934, and all other powers him in that behalf enabling, did on the 11th day of July, 1936, make an Order intituled "The Dead Meat (Import Regulation) Order, 1936," prohibiting the importation of fresh, frozen or chilled dead meat into this Isle between the 1st day of January and the 31st day of May, and between the 1st day of October and the 31st day of December in any year, except under the authority of a licence issued on behalf of the Governor by the Government Secretary or other duly authorised officer.

AND WHEREAS the Lieutenant Governor, acting in pursuance of the aforesaid powers, did:-

- (1) on the 11th day of August, 1938, make an Order intituled "The Dead Meat (Import Regulation) Order, 1938," prohibiting the importation of fresh mutton and lamb into this Isle during the month of September in any year except under the authority of a licence issued on behalf of the Governor by the Government Secretary or other duly authorised officer; and
- (2) on the 22nd day of August, 1939, make an Order intituled "The Dead Meat (Import Regulation) Order, 1939," prohibiting the importation of frozen and chilled mutton and lamb into this Isle during the month of September in any year except under the authority of a licence issued on behalf of the Governor by the Government Secretary or other duly authorised officer.

AND WHEREAS the Advisory Committee under the said Act has recommended that fresh, frozen and chilled dead meat should not be allowed to be imported into this Isle at any time except under licence.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, the said Lieutenant Governor, acting under the powers aforesaid, and on the recommendation of the Advisory Committee, DO HEREBY ORDER that fresh, frozen or chilled mutton and lamb shall not be imported into this Isle during the months of June, July and August in any year, and fresh, frozen or chilled beef, veal and pork shall not be imported into this Isle during the months of June, July, August and September in any year, except under the authority of a licence to be issued on my behalf by the Government Secretary or any other duly authorised officer and on such conditions and subject to such provisions as may be specified in such licence.

THIS ORDER may be cited as "The Dead Meat (Import Regulation) Order, 1940," and this Order and the Dead Meat (Import Regulation) Orders, 1936 and 1939, may be together cited as "The Dead Meat (Import Regulation) Orders, 1936 and 1940."
