



## ISLE OF MAN INTERNMENT CAMPS.

### Recreation and Exercise for Prisoners.

---

1. It is hoped to provide recreation fields in close proximity to each Internment Camp as soon as all the Camps have been formed and it is possible to proceed with the wiring of such recreation grounds.
2. Schemes for employing prisoners outside the Camps will also be taken in hand as soon as possible.
3. If the present Camp accommodation should not be sufficient for reasonable exercise, there is no objection to Camp Commandants arranging for route marches, provided the necessary escort can be found.
4. Prisoners in Camps in close proximity to the sea may be permitted to bathe in the sea opposite their Camps, provided escorts can be found and the prisoners of one Camp are not permitted to intermingle with the prisoners of adjoining Camps. Any prisoner who bathes in the sea must possess a suitable costume; steps will be taken for these to be on sale at Camp canteens.
