



**THE DEFENCE (General) REGULATIONS (Isle of Man), 1939**

**CLOSING OF ROADS - CRESCENT, DOUGLAS**

His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor has, under the powers vested in him by the Defence (General) Regulations (Isle of Man), 1939, made an Order, a copy of which is appended, stopping up a portion of the highway and right of way thereover in the Borough of Douglas, being a highway and right of way through or adjoining land appropriated for use in His Majesty's Service, such highway and right of way being coloured pink on the plan annexed to the Order, and including part of the Douglas Promenade opposite Metropole Mansions.

Failure to comply with the terms of the Order renders a person liable to the penalties imposed by the Defence Regulations.

**THE DEFENCE (GENERAL) REGULATIONS (ISLE OF MAN), 1939**

**CONTROL OF HIGHWAYS - CRESCENT, DOUGLAS**

I, the said Lieutenant Governor, in exercise of the powers vested in me under the Defence (General) Regulations (Isle of Man), 1939, hereby Direct that the highway or right of way coloured pink on the plan hereto annexed, passing through certain premises in the Borough of Douglas, appropriated for use in His Majesty's service, or through land adjoining such premises, shall be forthwith stopped up, and DO HEREBY Prohibit the exercise of any right of way, or the use of such highway.

AND I DO HEREBY give authority to Bertram Edward Sargeant, Government Secretary, to take all such steps as appear to him to be necessary and expedient in connection with the stopping up of such highway or right of way.
