THE DEFENCE REGULATIONS (ISLE OF MAN), 1939.

THE CASTRATION OF RAM LAMBS (AMENDMENT) ORDER, 1940.

His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor has, under the powers vested in him by the Defence Regulations (Isle of Man), 1939, made an Order dated the 8th June, 1940, (a copy of which is appended) amending the Castration of Ram Lambs Order, 1940.

The effect of the amendment is that, during the month of June, 1940, a ram lamb of a liveweight of 60 lbs. or more, which has not been castrated, may be sent to Ramsey, Ballasalla or St. John's Mart for sale in accordance with the Fat Sheep and Lambs (Regulation of Sale) (No. 2 Amendment) Order, 1940.

On and after the 1st July, 1940, it will be an offence for any person to slaughter or to agree to slaughter an uncastrated ram lamb other than an uncastrated ram lamb in respect of which a Certificate of Approval has been issued under the Castration of Ram Lambs Order, 1940.

THE CASTRATION OF RAM LAMBS (AMENDMENT) ORDER, 1940.

I, the said Lieutenant Governor, by virtue of the powers vested in me by the Defence Regulations (Isle of Man), 1939, and all other powers me in that behalf enabling, DO HEREBY Order as follows :-

1. Notwithstanding anything contained in Article 1 of the Castration of Ram Lambs Order, 1940, (Hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order") a ram lamb of a liveweight of 60 lbs. or more which has not been castrated may be sent to a Centre for Sale in accordance with the Fat Sheep and Lambs (Regulation of Sale) (No. 2 Amendment) Order, 1940, between the date hereof and the 30th/June, 1940.

2. For the purpose of ascertaining the liveweight of an uncastrated ram lamb offered for sale in a Centre, the Certifying Officer may require the owner to weigh the animal in the presence of the Certifying Officer.
3. After the 30th day of June, 1940, no person shall slaughter or agree to slaughter any uncastrated ram lamb other than an uncastrated ram lamb in respect of which a Certificate of Approval has been issued under Article 4 of the principal Order, and which, in consequence of accident or other cause, it is deemed advisable to slaughter.

4. For the purposes of this Order and the principal Order, unless the context otherwise requires, the expressions used therein shall have the same meaning as in the Fat Sheep and Lambs (Regulation of Sale) Order, 1939.
5. Infringements of this Order are offences against the Defence Regulations (Isle of Man), 1939.
6. This Order may be cited as "The Castration of Ram Lambs (Amendment) Order, 1940."
