### The Inspection of Land Order, 1940.

His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor has, under the powers vested in him by the Defence Regulations (Isle of Man), 1939, made an Order, dated the 17th June, 1940, (a copy of which is appended) which provides that any officer of the Board of Agriculture for the Isle of Man, or other person duly authorised by the Board, shall have power to enter on and inspect any land for the purpose of obtaining information as to the user of the land.

Any person wilfully obstructing or impeding any officer or other person acting under the authority of the Order shall be deemed to have committed an offence under the Defence Regulations (Isle of Man), 1939.

### The Defence Regulations (Isle of Man), 1939. The Inspection of Land Order, 1940.

I, the said Lieutenant Governor, by virtue of the powers vested in me by the Defence Regulations (Isle of Man), 1939, and all other powers me in that behalf enabling, DO HEREBY Order as follows :—

- (1) Any officer of the Board of Agriculture for the Isle of Man or other person duly authorised by the said Board shall have power to enter on and inspect any land for the purpose of obtaining information as to the user of the land.
- (2) Any person who wilfully obstructs or impedes any officer of the said Board or other person acting under the authority of this Order shall be deemed to have committed an offence under the Defence Regulations (Isle of Man), 1939.
- (3) This Order may be cited as "The Inspection of Land Order, 1940."
