



The Defence Regulations (Isle of Man), 1939.

The Tomatoes (Prices) (No. 2) Order, 1940.

His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor has under the powers vested in him by the Defence Regulations (Isle of Man), 1939, made an Order dated the 20th June, 1940, (a copy of which is appended) amending the prices fixed for tomatoes grown in the Isle of Man.

The new prices which operate as and from the 21st June, 1940, until further notice are:—

Wholesale	...	1/-	per lb. delivered.
Retail	...	1/4d.	per lb.

Failure to comply with the terms of the Order renders a person liable to the penalties imposed by the Defence Regulations.

1. In Article 3 of the Tomatoes (Prices) (No. 1) Order, 1940, there shall be substituted for the figures "1/3d." and "1/8d." the figures "1/-" and "1/4d." respectively.
2. This Order may be cited as "The Tomatoes (Prices) (No. 2) Order, 1940," and shall come into force on the 21st day of June, 1940.
