



The Defence Regulations (Isle of Man), 1939. The Protected Area (Rushen Internment Camp) Order, 1940.

His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor has, under the powers vested in him by the Defence Regulations (Isle of Man), 1939, made an Order, a copy of which is appended, declaring the area of the Rushen Internment Camp a protected area.

The following persons only may enter or be within the Protected Area :—

- (1) Residents in the Area.
- (2) Enemy aliens interned in the protected area.
- (3) Persons to whom authority is granted by me or on my behalf to enter the protected area, subject to such conditions (if any) as may be specified in the document of authority.
- (4) Persons having legitimate business within the protected area, whose entry is authorised by or under the authority of the Chief Constable, subject to such conditions as may be imposed by the Chief Constable.

Any person in the protected area in contravention of the Order may be removed from the area, without prejudice to any proceedings which may be taken against him.

Failure to comply with the terms of the Order renders a person liable to the penalties imposed by the Defence Regulations.

ISLE OF MAN TO WIT.

The Protected Area (Rushen Internment Camp) Order, 1940.

In pursuance of Regulation No. 13 of the Defence Regulations (Isle of Man) 1939, I, the said Lieutenant Governor, DO hereby make the following Order :—

1. I declare the area described in the Schedule hereto to be a Protected Area for the purposes of the said Regulation.
2. In addition to residents within the protected area the following persons shall be permitted to be within the protected area as from the date of this Order :
 - (1) enemy aliens interned in the protected area.
 - (2) persons to whom authority is granted by me or on my behalf to enter the protected area, subject to such conditions (if any) as may be specified in the document of authority.
 - (3) persons having legitimate business within the protected area, whose entry is authorised by or under the authority of the Chief Constable, subject to such conditions as may be imposed by the Chief Constable.
3. This Order shall come into force forthwith and may be cited as "The Protected Area (Rushen Internment Camp) Order, 1940."

SCHEDULE TO THE PROTECTED AREA (RUSHEN INTERNMENT CAMP) ORDER, 1940.

PROTECTED AREA.

The Rushen Internment Camp for the detention of female enemy aliens, being that area comprising the Village Districts of Port Erin and Port St Mary and portions of the Parish of Rushen, South and West of a line delineated and coloured pink on the plan attached to the Order made by me, dated the 31st day of May, 1940, controlling highways and rights of way leading from the said area to other parts of the Island.
