



The Defence Regulations (Isle of Man), 1939.

The Passenger Traffic (Isle of Man, Northern Ireland and Eire) Prohibition Order, 1940.

His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor has, under the powers vested in him by the Defence Regulations (Isle of Man), 1939, made an Order, a copy of which is appended, providing that, on and after the 29th June, 1940, no person other than a member of the duly constituted crew shall disembark in the Isle of Man from a vessel which has proceeded from, or shall depart from the Island in a vessel which is proceeding to, Northern Ireland or Eire.

Failure to comply with the terms of the Order renders a person liable to the penalties imposed by the Defence Regulations.

ISLE OF MAN TO WIT.

BY HIS EXCELLENCY VICE-ADMIRAL THE RIGHT HONOURABLE THE EARL GRANVILLE, C.B., D.S.O., LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR OF THE SAID ISLE, &c., &c., &c.

The Defence Regulations (Isle of Man), 1939.

The Passenger Traffic (Isle of Man, Northern Ireland and Eire) Prohibition Order, 1940.

I, the said Lieutenant Governor, by virtue of the powers conferred upon me by the Defence Regulations (Isle of Man), 1939, and all other powers me in that behalf enabling, DO HEREBY Order as follows:—

1. No person other than a member of the duly constituted crew shall disembark in the Isle of Man from a vessel which has proceeded from Northern Ireland or Eire.
2. No person other than a member of the duly constituted crew shall depart from the Isle of Man in a vessel proceeding to Northern Ireland or Eire.
3. This Order may be cited as "The Passenger Traffic (Isle of Man, Northern Ireland and Eire) Prohibition Order, 1940" and shall come into force on the 29th day of June, 1940.
