**The Alien Internees (Rushen Internment Camp)
Banking Restriction Order, 1940.**

His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor has, under the powers vested in him by the Defence Regulations (Isle of Man) 1939, and the Aliens Restriction Act, 1922, made an Order, dated 27th June, 1940, a copy of which is appended, prohibiting alien internees in the Rushen Internment Camp withdrawing from banking accounts which they have opened with the Insular Banks sums in excess of Five shillings weekly, except through the Commandant of the Camp.

Failure to comply with the terms of the Order renders a person liable to the penalties imposed by the Defence Regulations.

**THE ALIEN INTERNEES (RUSHEN INTERNMENT CAMP)
BANKING RESTRICTION ORDER, 1940.**

I, the said Lieutenant Governor, by virtue of the powers in me vested by the Defence Regulations (Isle of Man) 1939, and the Aliens Restriction Act, 1922, and all other powers me in that behalf enabling DO hereby Order that no alien internee of the Rushen Internment Camp shall withdraw from any bank carrying on business in this Isle a sum in excess of Five shillings in any week except through the Commandant of such Camp and no Bank shall pay to an internee any sum except as authorised by this Order.

This Order may be cited as "The Alien Internees (Rushen Internment Camp) Banking Restriction Order, 1940," and shall come into force on the 29th day of June, 1940.
