**The Defence Regulations (Isle of Man), 1939.  
Cutting of Turf.**

---

In pursuance of the powers vested in me by Regulations 53 and 57 of the Defence Regulations (Isle of Man) 1939, and of all other powers and authorities me in this behalf enabling, I, the said Lieutenant Governor, do hereby Order as follows:—

1. Notwithstanding anything contained in any enactment it shall be lawful for the Treasurer to authorise any person to enter upon, cut and treat turf on any common or public turbaries within this Isle, and to use, sell or otherwise dispose of such turf in such manner as the Treasurer may deem proper for the purpose of maintaining supplies and services essential to the life of the community.

2. Any person authorised as aforesaid shall comply with any special or general direction issued by the Treasurer as to the removal, transport, keeping, storage, disposal or delivery of the turf.

3. The provisions contained in any enactment limiting the period during which turf may be cut shall not apply to the Treasurer in the exercise of the powers vested in him by section 1 of this Order.

4. "Treasurer" means the Treasurer of the Isle of Man acting on behalf of the Governor, or any other officer nominated by the Governor for the purpose of this Order.

"Governor" has the same meaning as in the Defence Regulations (Isle of Man) 1939.

5. This Order may be cited as "The Cutting of Turf (Isle of Man) Order, 1940."
