



THE ALIENS RESTRICTION ACTS, 1922 to 1930.

The Aliens Restriction Order (No. 2) 1940.

His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor, by virtue of the powers vested in him by the Aliens Restriction Act, 1922, and all other powers him in that behalf enabling, has made an Order entitled "The Aliens Restriction Order (No. 2) 1940" exempting from the requirements of the Order aliens leaving the Island under military or Police escort.

Aliens proceeding under escort to the mainland from places of Internment in the Isle of Man will not in future have to be the subjects of permits from Government Office.

The Aliens Restriction Order (No. 2) 1940.

I, the said Lieutenant Governor, acting in pursuance of the powers vested in me by the Aliens Restriction Act, 1922, and all other powers me in that behalf enabling DO hereby make the following Order :

1. Notwithstanding anything contained in article 4 of the Aliens Restriction Order, 1939, a permit to leave this Isle shall not be necessary in the case of an alien who is released from an Internment Camp in this Isle and who is proceeding to his or her destination accompanied by a military or Police escort throughout the journey to such destination.

2. This Order shall come into force on the 2nd day of July, 1940, and may be cited as "The Aliens Restriction Order (No. 2) 1940".
