



The Defence (General) Regulations (Isle of Man) 1939.

Closing of Lift and Footpath—Falcon Cliff Hotel.

His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor has, under the powers vested in him by the Defence (General) Regulations (Isle of Man) 1939, made an Order, a copy of which is appended, directing that the Lift at the Falcon Cliff Hotel, Douglas, shall not be used, and that the footpath and right of way leading from Palace View to Falcon Cliff Hotel shall be stopped up.

Failure to comply with the terms of the Order renders a person liable to the penalties imposed by the Defence Regulations.

THE DEFENCE (GENERAL) REGULATIONS (ISLE OF MAN), 1939. CLOSING OF LIFT AND FOOTPATH—FALCON CLIFF HOTEL.

I, the said Lieutenant Governor, in exercise of the powers vested in me under the Defence (General) Regulations (Isle of Man), 1939, hereby direct that the Lift at the Falcon Cliff Hotel, Douglas, shall not be used.

And I do further direct that the footpath leading from Palace View, Douglas, to the said Falcon Cliff Hotel, passing through land adjoining certain premises in the Borough of Douglas, appropriated for use in His Majesty's Service, shall be forthwith stopped up, and Do Hereby prohibit the exercise of any right of way or the use of such footpath.

And I do hereby give authority to Bertram Edward Sargeaunt, Government Secretary, to take all such steps as appear to him to be necessary and expedient in connection with the stopping up of such Lift, footpath or right of way.
