



The Defence (General) Regulations (Isle of Man) 1939.

**REGULATION OF TRAFFIC
ON BALLAQUAYLE ROAD AND BROADWAY.**

His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor has, under the powers vested in him by the Defence (General) Regulations (Isle of Man) 1939, made an Order, a copy of which is appended, providing that no vehicular traffic shall proceed up Ballaquayle Road from its junction with Victoria Road and Glen Falcon Road to its junction with York Road, and that all vehicular traffic from the Promenade up Broadway shall proceed by way of Derby Road, Glen Falcon Road or Victoria Road.

Failure to comply with the terms of the Order renders a person liable to the penalties imposed by the Defence Regulations.

REGULATION 70.

I, the said Lieutenant Governor, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by Regulation 70 of the Defence (General) Regulations (Isle of Man) 1939, and of all other powers me in that behalf enabling, DO hereby Order as follows:—

1. No vehicular traffic shall proceed upwards on the highway from the junction of Broadway, Victoria Road and Glen Falcon Road to the junction of York Road and Ballaquayle Road.
2. All vehicular traffic from the Promenade up Broadway shall proceed by way of Derby Road, Glen Falcon Road or Victoria Road.
3. This Order shall come into operation on the 12th day of July, 1940.
