



The Defence (General) Regulations (Isle of Man) 1939.

THE TEA ORDER, 1940.

His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor, in pursuance of the powers vested in him by the Defence (General) Regulations (Isle of Man) 1939, has made an Order, a copy of which is appended,

- (1) prohibiting any person from purchasing for his or her own consumption or for that of any person in his or her house or establishment Tea in excess of Two ounces per head per week ;
- (2) prohibiting any person from purchasing Tea by retail for any person other than the persons specified in (1) above.

Every retailer of tea is required to bring to the notice of every person purchasing tea from him the provisions of the Order.

Failure to comply with the terms of the Order renders a person liable to the penalties imposed by the Defence Regulations.

THE DEFENCE (GENERAL) REGULATIONS (ISLE OF MAN) 1939.

THE TEA ORDER, 1940.

I, the said Lieutenant Governor, acting in pursuance of the powers vested in me by the Defence (General) Regulations (Isle of Man) 1939, and all other powers me in that behalf enabling DO hereby Order as follows :—

1. No person shall purchase Tea for his or her own consumption or for that of any person in his or her house or establishment in excess of Two ounces (2 ozs.) per head per week.
2. No person shall purchase Tea by retail for any person other than the persons specified in article 1 hereof.
3. This Order may be cited as "The Tea Order, 1940," and shall come into force on the date hereof.
