CANCELLATION OF BANK HOLIDAY

His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor has, in pursuance of the powers vested in him by the Defence (General) Regulations (Isle of Man) 1939, made an Order, a copy of which is appended, directing that the 5th August, 1940, shall not be observed as a Bank Holiday in the Isle of Man.

THE DEFENCE (GENERAL) REGULATIONS (ISLE OF MAN) 1939
