



## Import Duties (Exemptions) (No. 8) (Isle of Man) Order, 1940.

His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor has made an Order (a copy of which is appended) under section one of the Isle of Man (Customs) Act 1932, and subsection (2) of section five of the Isle of Man (Customs) Act, 1934, directing, inter alia, that the goods specified in the Schedule to such Order shall be added to the First Schedule to the Isle of Man (Customs), Act, 1932, and that the said Schedule as amended by the Import Duties (Exemptions Consolidation) (Isle of Man) Order, 1936, and by subsequent Orders shall be further amended.

### CUSTOMS

#### THE IMPORT DUTIES (EXEMPTIONS) (No. 8) (ISLE OF MAN) ORDER, 1940.

(MACHINERY, Etc.).

Whereas the Treasury has by Order (No. 7) dated the 3rd day of July, 1940, made under sections 1 and 19 of the Import Duties Act, 1932, section 10 of the Finance Act, 1934, and section 1 of the Import Duties (Emergency Provisions) Act, 1939, ordered that the goods specified in the Schedule to the Order be added to the First Schedule to the Import Duties Act, 1932, and that the said First Schedule as amended by the Import Duties (Exemptions Consolidation) Order 1935, and by subsequent Orders, shall be further amended, and that the Import Duties (General) Order, 1935, hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Treasury Order" shall also be further amended.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, the said Lieutenant Governor, by virtue of the powers conferred on me by section 1 of the Isle of Man (Customs) Act, 1932, and by sub-section (2) of section 5 of the Isle of Man (Customs) Act, 1934, and of all powers enabling me in that behalf, make the following Order:—

1. The goods specified in the Schedule to this Order shall be added to the First Schedule to the Isle of Man (Customs) Act, 1932.
2. The said First Schedule as amended by the Import Duties (Exemptions Consolidation) (Isle of Man) Order, 1936, and by subsequent Orders, shall be further amended by inserting therein, after Group XV, as Group XVI therein, the words, letters and figures contained in the Schedule to this Order, and the second Annex to the Import Duties (Exemptions Consolidation) (Isle of Man) Order 1936, as amended by subsequent Orders shall be further amended in like manner.
3. References in the Import Duties (General) (Isle of Man) Order, 1936, to the Schedule to the Principal Treasury Order shall be construed as references to that Schedule as amended by the said Treasury Order (No. 7) of the 3rd July, 1940.
4. (1) This Order may be cited as the Import Duties (Exemptions) (No. 8) (Isle of Man) Order, 1940.  
(2) This Order shall come into operation on the 15th day of July, 1940.

## SCHEDULE.

(1) **Machinery** and parts thereof, and, when imported therewith, accessories to machinery or to parts of machinery (including articles comprised in paragraphs (2) to (6) of this Group) but not including articles comprised in the List of Exceptions set out at the end of this Group.

(2) **Ball bearings** and parts thereof.

(3) **Roller bearings** and parts thereof.

(4) **Ploughs, planters and seeders** and parts of ploughs, planters and seeders.

(5) **Machinery belting** (including conveyor and elevator bands).

(6) (i) **Aeroplanes and seaplanes** (including flying boats and any other aircraft designed to manoeuvre on the water).

(ii) **Parts** of any of the articles comprised in the preceding sub-paragraph.

(iii) **Accessories** to any of the articles comprised in sub-paragraph (i) or (ii) of this paragraph when imported with those articles.

### THE LIST OF EXCEPTIONS ABOVE REFERRED TO.

(a) Clocks and watches.

(b) Electrical goods of the following descriptions:—

(i) Telegraph and Telephone apparatus.

(ii) Bell apparatus and meters.

(iii) Cooking and heating apparatus.

(c) Motor-cars (including motor bicycles and motor tricycles) and agricultural tractors other than tracklaying tractors.

(d) Cycles.

(e) Coin or disc operated machines for games.

(f) Toys.

(g) Musical instruments (including gramophones and pianolas and other similar instruments).

(h) Parts of, and accessories to, any of the articles comprised in any of the preceding heads.
