



## **The Defence (General) Regulations (Isle of Man) 1939.**

### **The Margarine and Cooking Fats (Regulation of Importation and Exportation) Order, 1940.**

His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor has made an Order, a copy of which is appended, providing that on and after the 22nd July, 1940, no margarine or cooking fats as defined in the Order shall be imported into or exported from the Isle of Man except under the authority of a licence issued on behalf of the Governor by the Government Secretary or other authorised officer.

Failure to comply with the terms of the Order renders a person liable to the penalties imposed by the Defence Regulations.

## **The Defence (General) Regulations (Isle of Man), 1939.**

### **The Margarine and Cooking Fats (Regulation of Importation and Exportation) Order, 1940.**

I, the said Lieutenant Governor, acting in pursuance of the powers vested in me by the Defence (General) Regulations (Isle of Man), 1939, and all other powers me in that behalf enabling, DO HEREBY Order as follows:—

1. On and after the date when this Order comes into force, no margarine or cooking fats shall be imported into or exported from the Isle of Man except under the authority of a licence issued on my behalf by the Government Secretary or other duly authorised Officer and on such conditions and subject to such restrictions as may be specified in such licence.

2. Any officer of police or customs or any other person authorised by me in that behalf may examine any package which he has reason to believe contains any margarine or cooking fat which is intended for exportation from or has been imported into the Isle of Man in contravention of the terms of this Order and may for that purpose direct that any covering or wrapping shall be removed therefrom. He may seize and detain any margarine or cooking fats which have been submitted for exportation from or have been imported into the Isle of Man in contravention of the terms of this Order.

3. For the purposes of this Order, "cooking fats" includes any shortening, confectionery, or other fat suitable for human food or for use in the preparation, manufacture or treatment of human food, made wholly or partly from one or more vegetable or animal oils or fats (including fish and marine animal oils or fats) but does not include butter, margarine, animal lard, suet, dripping, the products known as hard butters or any cooking oil.

4. This Order may be cited as "The Margarine and Cooking Fats (Regulation of Importation and Exportation) Order, 1940" and shall come into force on the 22nd day of July, 1940.
