The Regulation of Payments (Belgian Congo and Ruanda-Urundi) (Isle of Man) Order, 1940.

The following Order, made by the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, is issued for general information and observance.

THE REGULATION OF PAYMENTS (BELGIAN CONGO AND RUANDA-URUNDI) (ISLE OF MAN) ORDER, 1940, DATED JULY 17, 1940.

Whereas by paragraph (1) of Regulation three C of the Defence (Finance) Regulations (Isle of Man), 1939, restrictions are placed on payments, transfers and other transactions to or in favour of persons resident outside the sterling area, but those restrictions are subject to any exemptions which may be granted by order of the Treasury.

And whereas it is expedient to make, in relation to the Belgian Congo and Ruanda-Urundi, such provision as is hereinafter specified :

Now, therefore, the Treasury, in pursuance of their powers under the said Regulation three C and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, hereby make the following Order :—

1. This Order may be cited as the Regulation of Payments (Belgian Congo and Ruanda-Urundi) (Isle of Man) Order, 1940.
2. The following are exempted from the operation of paragraph (1) of the said Regulation three C :—
 - (a) anything done for the purpose of making a payment in sterling to the credit of a person resident in the Belgian Congo or Ruanda-Urundi, being a payment made with permission granted by or on behalf of the Treasury;
 - (b) anything done for the purpose of the transfer of the whole or any part of an amount standing to the credit of the account, with a banker in the Isle of Man, of a person resident in the Belgian Congo or Ruanda-Urundi, being a transfer to the credit of the account with such a banker of another person resident in the Belgian Congo or Ruanda-Urundi;
 - (c) anything done for the purpose of making a payment in francs congolais obtained, after the third day of September, nineteen hundred and thirty-nine, from an authorised dealer, being such a payment as was specified in the application to that dealer for those francs;
 - (d) anything done for the purpose of making a payment in francs congolais exempted by the Treasury or a person designated by the Treasury from Regulation five of the Defence (Finance) Regulations (Isle of Man), 1939, so long as any conditions subject to which the exemption was granted are complied with.
3. In this Order the expression "authorised dealer" means a person authorised by or on behalf of the Treasury under Regulation two of the Defence (Finance) Regulations (Isle of Man), 1939, to deal in foreign currency.
4. This Order shall come into force on the eighteenth day of July, 1940.
