SUPPLIES AND SERVICES.

The Flour Confectionery Order, 1950.

His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor has made the above styled Order, a copy of which is appended.

From 22nd January, 1950, the maximum price of cake and flour confectionery will be 1s. 9d. per lb., but where the combined content of fat, sugar and dry egg solids (or any two of them) amounts to 45% or more, or where for every pound of cake the ingredients cost 10d. or more, the maximum price will be 3s. 0d. per lb.

In addition, a charge will be allowed for packing cakes in a cardboard carton or box provided the charge does not exceed the reasonable and actual cost of the container. The Order provides for a maximum charge for packing, viz., 1½d. for the first lb. or part of a lb. of flour confectionery, 3d. where the flour confectionery weighs more than 1 lb. but not more than 2 lb., and 4d. where the flour confectionery weighs more than 2 lb.

(The maximum price of uncooked pastry, and the additional charges already allowed for containers of trifle and ready-made puddings, are unaltered).

Copies of the Order may be obtained at Government Office, or may be seen at any Police Station on application to the Officer in Charge, at the Douglas Public Library, the Douglas Town Hall and the Offices of all the Town and Village Commissioners.

Failure to comply with the terms of the Order renders a person liable to the penalties imposed by the Defence Regulations.

THE FLOUR CONFECTIONERY ORDER, 1950.

I, the said Lieutenant Governor, in exercise of the powers conferred upon me by Regulations 55 and 98 of the Defence (General) Regulations (Isle of Man), 1939, as having effect by virtue of the Supplies and Services (Transitional Powers) (Isle of Man), Order in Council, 1946, as extended by the Supplies and Services (Extended Purposes) (Isle of Man), Order in Council, 1948, DO hereby make the following Order:—

1. The Flour Confectionery (Control and Maximum Prices) Order, 1944, as amended, shall be further amended as follows:—

(a) by substituting in paragraph (3) of Article 5 thereof for the figure "3½d" the figure "10d" so that the said paragraph shall read—

"(3) The cost of the ingredients of any flour confectionery shall be deemed to amount to less than 10d. for every pound thereof until the contrary is proved.";

(b) by substituting for the Second Schedule thereto the Schedule to this Order.

2. This Order may be cited as The Flour Confectionery Order, 1950, and shall come into operation on the 22nd day of January, 1950.

THE SCHEDULE

(To be substituted for the Second Schedule to the Flour Confectionery (Control and Maximum Prices) Order, 1944).

THE SECOND SCHEDULE.

MAXIMUM PRICES OF FLOUR CONFECTIONERY

PART I.

Maximum Prices of Flour Confectionery other than Uncooked Pastry.

1. If—

- (a) the combined fat, sugar and dry egg solids content (or the combined content of any two of these ingredients) of any article of flour confectionery is 45 per cent. or more; or
- (b) the cost of the ingredients for every pound of any article of flour confectionery is 10d. or more; the maximum price (except in the case of uncooked pastry) shall be at the rate of 3s. 0d. per lb. net.

2. In all other cases (except in the case of uncooked pastry) the maximum price of flour confectionery shall be at the rate of 1s 9d. per lb. net.

PART II

Maximum Price of Uncooked Pastry.

The maximum price of uncooked pastry shall be at the rate of 1s. 0d. per lb. net.

PART 111

Additional Charges for Containers.

1. In this Part of this Schedule, references to the weight of any flour confectionery do not include the weight of the container.

2. On a sale of a ready-made pudding in a non-returnable basin supplied by the seller, a sum not exceeding—

(a) 3d., if the weight of the pudding is less than 3 lb.; or

(b) 1½d. for every complete pound that the pudding weighs, if its weight is 3 lb. or more;

may be added to the maximum price.

3. On a sale of trifle in a non-returnable cardboard container supplied by the seller, a sum not exceeding the actual and reasonable cost of the container to the seller may be added to the maximum price.

4. On any sale, not provided for in paragraphs 2 or 3 of this Part of this Schedule, of flour confectionery in a non-returnable cardboard container supplied by the seller, a sum not exceeding the actual and reasonable cost of the container to the seller, and not exceeding—

(a) 1½d. if the weight of the flour confectionery is not more than 1 lb.;

(b) 3d. if the weight of the flour confectionery is more than 1 lb., but not more than 2 lb.; or

(c) 4d. if the weight of the flour confectionery is more than 2 lb.;

may be added to the maximum price.

5. Except as provided in this Part of this Schedule, no charge shall be made for any wrapper or container on a sale of flour confectionery.
