THE BACON (RATIONING) ORDER, 1950.

His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor has made the above-styled Order further amending The Bacon (Rationing) Order, 1949.
(a)

This Order increases, as from 29th January, 1950, the amount of the bacon ration which may be obtained against appropriate coupons in Ration Books R.B.1, R.B.2, and R.B.4, Duty Ration Card R.B.8R. and Form R.B.12 from 4 oz. to 5 oz. per week. Appropriate coupons in these ration documents valid for use during the week beginning 22nd January, 1950, and the following week, but not used in the week beginning 22nd January, 1950, are valid, if used in the week beginning 29th January, 1950, for 4 oz. only.

Copies of the Order may be obtained at Government Office, or may be seen at any Police Station on application to the Officer in Charge, at the Douglas Public Library, the Douglas Town Hall and the Offices of all the Town and Village Commissioners.

THE BACON (RATIONING) ORDER, 1950.

I, the said Lieutenant Governor in exercise of the powers conferred upon me by Regulations 55 and 98 of the Defence (General) Regulations (Isle of Man), 1939, as having effect by virtue of the Supplies and Services (Transitional Powers) (Isle of Man) Order in Council, 1946, as extended by the Supplies and Services (Extended Purposes) (Isle of Man) Order in Council, 1948, DO hereby make the following Order:—

1.—The Bacon (Rationing) Order, 1949, as amended, shall be further amended by substituting for the Schedule thereto, which specifies the amount of the bacon ration, the Schedule to this Order.

2.—Notwithstanding the amendment affected by Article 1 of this Order the maximum amount of bacon which may be obtained or supplied against an appropriate coupon for bacon in a General Ration Book R.B.1, a Junior Ration Book R.B.4, a Child's Ration Book R.B.2, a Form R.B.12 and a Duty Ration Card R.B.8R. relating to the week beginning 22nd January, 1950, and valid for use during the said week and the following week, but not used during the said week beginning 22nd January, 1950, shall be 4 oz. net.

3.—This Order shall come into operation on the 29th January, 1950, and may be cited as The Bacon (Rationing) Order, 1950.

Where a Form R.G.48 relating to bacon is produced with a ration document the amount of bacon obtainable during the period of validity of such form against each appropriate coupon for bacon in the ration document shall be increased as specified on the form.
