**SUPPLIES AND SERVICES (TRANSITIONAL POWERS).**

**THE POULTRY (REGULATION OF EXPORT) ORDER, 1950.**

His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor has, under the powers vested in him by the Defence (General) Regulations (Isle of Man), 1939, as amended, made the above-styled Order, dated the 7th February, 1950, (a copy of which is appended), amending the Poultry (Regulation of Export) Order, 1942, so as to exclude growing chickens and ducklings not exceeding eight weeks of age from the expression "poultry" as defined therein.

Growing chickens and ducklings up to eight weeks of age may now be exported from the Isle of Man without restriction.

**THE POULTRY (REGULATION OF EXPORT) ORDER,  
1950.**

I, the said Lieutenant Governor, in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by Regulations 55, 55AA and 98 of the Defence (General) Regulations (Isle of Man), 1939, as having effect by virtue of the Supplies and Services (Transitional Powers) (Isle of Man) Order in Council, 1946, as extended by the Supplies and Services (Extended Purposes) (Isle of Man) Order in Council, 1948, DO HEREBY Order as follows:—

1. For the purposes of the Poultry (Regulation of Export) Order, 1942, as amended, poultry as defined therein shall be deemed not to include growing chickens and ducklings not exceeding eight weeks of age.
2. The Poultry (Regulation of Export) Order, 1946, is hereby revoked.
3. This Order may be cited as "The Poultry (Regulation of Export) Order, 1950."
