**The Control of Paper (Economy)  
(Amendment) Order, 1950.**

---

This Order amends the Control of Paper (Economy) Order, 1949, (Government Circular No. 183/49) as follows:—

1. The Principal Order now prohibits, subject to licence, the printing of contents posters and the exhibition of printed contents posters. Contents posters which are not printed are no longer controlled.
2. The prohibition now relates only to posters which announce publication, in one issue of a newspaper, magazine, periodical or news bulletin, of current news items or single features.

### THE CONTROL OF PAPER (ECONOMY) (AMENDMENT) ORDER, 1950.

I, the said Lieutenant Governor, in exercise of the powers conferred on me by Regulation 55 of the Defence (General) Regulations (Isle of Man), 1939, as having effect by virtue of the Supplies and Services (Transitional Powers) (Isle of Man) Order in Council, 1946, as extended by the Supplies and Services (Extended Purposes) (Isle of Man) Order in Council, 1948, DO hereby make the following Order:—

1. The Control of Paper (Economy) Order, 1949, shall have effect subject to the following amendments:—

(i) for Article 1 there shall be substituted the following Article:—

“1. Except under the authority of a licence granted by or on behalf of the Governor hereunder and in accordance with any conditions attaching thereto, no person shall print or cause to be printed any contents poster, or exhibit or cause to be exhibited any printed contents poster;”

(ii) in Article 5—

(a) for the definition of “contents poster” there shall be substituted the following definition:—

“‘contents poster’ means a notice composed of or containing paper the purpose of which is to indicate to the public any current or topical matter, or single feature, appearing in one particular issue of a newspaper, magazine, periodical or news bulletin, but does not include a notice the purpose of which is to indicate to the public any permanent or regular or recurring matter or feature appearing in a series of issues of a newspaper, magazine, periodical or news bulletin;” and

(b) the definitions of “make,” “made” and “making” and of “poster” shall be omitted.

2. This Order may be cited as the Control of Paper (Economy) (Amendment) Order, 1950, and shall come into operation on the 27th day of February, 1950.
