THE ORANGES (REGULATION OF SALE) ORDER, (NO.7). 1942.

GENERAL LICENCE
NO. 58.

His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor hereby licences under the above-mentioned Order, during the continuance in force of this Licence, the sale of Palestine oranges by retail subject to the following conditions:-

1. Except as provided in paragraph 2 hereof, on and from the 28th February, 1950, up to and including the 4th March, 1950.

- (a) Palestine oranges may only be sold or purchased on the production by the purchaser at the time of sale of General Ration Book R.B.1, a Child's Ration Book R.B.2, a Junior Ration Book R.B.4, an Expectant Mother's Ration Book R.B.7 a Duty Ration Card R.B.8R, a Weekly Seaman's Ration Book R.B.6, a Temporary Ration Document R.B.12S endorsed "MS";
- (b) At the time of sale the seller must cancel in ink or indelible pencil a coupon as follows:-
 - (i) in an R.B.1, R.B.2 or R.B.4, the coupon numbered 34 in panel 2, Section 9 on page 43;
 - (ii) in a R.B.8R, the coupon numbered "Panel 2" in the Fourth week of the period for which the card is available;
 - (iii) in an R.B.6, the coupon numbered "Panel2" on the page relating to week 41.

- (iv) in an R.B.12S, or an R.B.12 endorsed "MS"; a coupon numbered "Panel 2" valid during the week numbered 41.
- (c) In an R.B.7, the seller will endorse the coupon marked "1Z". The endorsement in this instance will be "0.34".
- (d) The total weight sold or purchased in respect of each ration document specified in paragraph 1(b) hereof shall not exceed one pound of oranges.
- (e) Retailers of oranges shall display prominently in their windows all oranges possessed by them for sale together with the following notice:-

"PALESTINE ORANGES NOW AVAILABLE FOR SALE FOR HOLDERS OF CERTAIN RATION DOCUMENTS":

2. After the 4th March, 1950, and up to the date when this Licence ceases to be in force, oranges may be sold to anyone without restriction. Oranges must, however, continue to be displayed in the windows.
3. If they have supplies available retailers must supply oranges to anyone presenting the appropriate ration book unmarked for the allocation being sold, and must not give preference to regular customers, including those registered for other foods.
4. This Licence cancels General Licence No.57 dated 27th January, 1950, issued under the authority of The Oranges (Regulation of Sale) Order, (No.7), 1942.
