

SUPPLIES AND SERVICES

The Food (Points Rationing) Order, 1950.

His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor has made the above styled Order, a copy of which is appended, further amending the Food (Points Rationing) (No. 5) Order, 1949

This amending Order—

- (a) frees canned pork, imported quick frozen pre-cooked meat meals, Vienna sausages, dried plums or prunes, and all stoned dates from the provisions of the Order;
- (b) reduces the points values of Mexican meat and gravy, canned Tunny (Tuna) and canned beans;
- (c) increases the points values of certain imported canned fruits, currants, sultanas, sweet or semi-sweet biscuits (including biscuits partly covered with chocolate) and table jellies.

The Order comes into force on the 28th February, 1950.

Copies of the Order may be obtained at Government Office, or may be seen at any Police Station on application to the Officer in Charge, at the Douglas Public Library, the Douglas Town Hall and the Offices of all the Town and Village Commissioners.

Failure to comply with the terms of the Order renders a person liable to the penalties imposed by the Defence Regulations.

SUPPLIES AND SERVICES

The Food (Points Rationing) Order, 1950.

I, the said Lieutenant Governor in exercise of the powers conferred upon me by Regulation 55 and 98 of the Defence (General) Regulations (Isle of Man), 1939, as having effect by virtue of the Supplies and Services (Transition Powers) (Isle of Man) Order in Council, 1946, as extended by the Supplies and Services (Extended Purposes) (Isle of Man) Order in Council, 1948, DO hereby make the following Order:—

1. The Food (Points Rationing) (No. 5) Order, 1949, as amended, shall be further amended by substituting for the Second Schedule thereto the Schedule to this Order.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the 26th day of February, 1950, and may be cited as the Food (Points Rationing) Order, 1950.

THE SCHEDULE

Points Rationed Foods.

Notes.—(1) Unless a contrary intention appears, the equivalent number of points for food sold or supplied on any occasion shall be calculated on the net weight or gross weight, as the case may be, of the food according to the basis on which it is sold or supplied on that occasion.

(2) Where the number of points calculated in accordance with the provisions of this Schedule in respect of all the points rationed foods supplied on any occasion is less than one, that number shall be treated as one, and where being more than one it includes any fraction less than one, that fraction if less than one-half shall be disregarded, but otherwise shall be treated as one.

PART I.

MEAT AND MEAT PRODUCTS

(OTHER THAN IMPORTED QUICK FROZEN PRE-COOKED MEAT MEALS).

(Canned, or packed in an airtight container made wholly or mainly of glass or earthenware, including meat and meat products which, having been so packed, have been removed from such container).

For the purpose of calculating the equivalent number of points for any container or weight of meat or meat product, if it should weigh less than one ounce it shall be treated as one ounce, otherwise a fraction of an ounce shall be disregarded.
