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# THE FOOD (Retail Prices) (No. 2) ORDER, 1950

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His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor has made the above-styled Order, a copy of which is appended, further amending The Food (Retail Prices) Consolidation Order, 1949 (a).

This amending Order releases from price control the following varieties of cheese :—

- Stilton cheese
- Imported blue vein cheese
- Emmenthal cheese
- Blue Cheshire cheese
- Saint Paulin cheese
- Italian full cream soft cheese.

The Order comes into force on the 6th March, 1950.

Copies of the Order may be obtained at Government Office, or may be seen at any Police Station on application to the Officer in Charge, at the Douglas Public Library, the Douglas Town Hall and the Offices of all the Town and Village Commissioners.

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# THE FOOD (Retail Prices) (No. 2) ORDER, 1950

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I, the said Lieutenant Governor in exercise of the powers conferred upon me by Regulations 55 and 98 of the Defence (General) Regulations (Isle of Man), 1939, as having effect by virtue of the Supplies and Services (Transitional Powers) (Isle of Man) Order in Council, 1946, as extended by the Supplies and Services (Extended Purposes) (Isle of Man) Order in Council, 1948, DO hereby make the following Order :—

1. The Food (Retail Prices) Consolidation Order, 1949, shall be further amended as follows :—

(a) by substituting for the definition of cheese in Article I thereof the following definition

“‘Cheese’ means any description of cheese, including processed cheese, except—

(a) home produced blue vein cheese other than Stilton cheese and Blue Cheshire cheese;

(b) soft cheese or curd cheese;

(c) home produced cheese made from milk other than cows' milk; and

(d) Brie, Camembert, Carre de l'Est, Demi-sel, Emmenthal, Parmesan, Pont l'Eveque and Saint Paulin cheese, imported blue vein cheese and Italian full cream soft cheese”;

(b) by substituting for the Schedule of Foods and Prices thereto the Schedule of Foods and Prices to this Order.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the 6th day of March, 1950, and may be cited as The Food (Retail Prices) (No. 2) Order, 1950.
