### THE GOODS AND SERVICES (PRICE CONTROL) (No. 86) ORDER, 1950.

---

His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor has made an Order under the Goods and Services (Price Control) Act, 1941, as extended to the Isle of Man by the Goods and Services (Price Control) (Isle of Man) Order, 1943, providing that the maximum prices and/or charges to be charged in the Isle of Man for

Imported Carpets  
Perambulators

shall be the same as those fixed by Orders made by the Board of Trade.

The Schedules of Orders of His Excellency (Nos. 80 and 81) have been amended to conform with revocations of Orders of the Board of Trade replaced by Orders referred to in the First Schedule to this Order.

The Order comes into force on the 15th day of March, 1950.

The Board of Trade Orders concerned are specified in the First Schedule to the Order a copy of which is appended.

The Imported Carpets (Maximum Prices) Order, 1950, S.I. 1950 No. 191 (price 1d.) applies to all imported carpets, supersedes the Imported Carpets (Maximum Prices) (No. 2) Order, 1949. The principal changes are as follows:—

- (1) Importers' and wholesalers' maximum prices are fixed at the delivered cost and  $12\frac{1}{2}$  per cent, thereof in the case of sales otherwise than by retail, and  $36\frac{2}{3}$  per cent. thereof in the case of sales by retail.
- (2) Retailers' maximum prices are fixed at the purchase price paid and  $36\frac{2}{3}$  per cent. thereof.
- (3) All the above maximum prices are subject to a ceiling price computed at the rate of 54s. od. per square yard.
- (4) Provision is made for composite businesses.
- (5) Definitions of "carpets," "imported carpets" and "purchase price" are provided.

The Perambulators (Maximum Prices) Order, 1950, S.I. 1950 No. 192 (price 1d.) supersedes the Perambulators (Maximum Prices) Order 1949. Maximum prices are now fixed for a Class I perambulator and a Class I bed-folder of which specifications are provided.

The Orders, specified in the First Schedule to the Order, may be seen or purchased at the Office of the Secretary of the Price Regulation Committee, 1, Hope Street, Douglas, or may be seen at any Police Station

on application to the Officer in Charge, at the Douglas Public Library, the Douglas Town Hall and the Offices of all the Town and Village Commissioners.

Failure to comply with the terms of the Order renders a person liable to prosecution.

#### THE GOODS AND SERVICES (MAXIMUM PRICES) (No. 86) ORDER, 1950.

WHEREAS the Board of Trade under the powers vested in them under the Goods and Services (Price Control) Act, 1941, have from time to time made Orders fixing the maximum prices and/or charges to be charged in the course of the businesses comprising the sale of goods and/or the performing of services in relation thereto, and requiring the keeping of records and the display of notices in respect of certain goods in the course of such businesses, and it is desirable that the prices and charges of such goods and services so fixed should be the maximum prices and charges to be charged and that such records should be kept and such notices displayed on respect of such businesses in the Isle of Man.

NOW I, the said Lieutenant Governor, by virtue of the powers conferred on me by Sections 1, 13 and 18 of the Goods and Services (Price Control) Act, 1941, as extended to the Isle of Man by the Goods and Services (Price Control) (Isle of Man) Order in Council, 1943, and all other powers and authorities me in this behalf enabling, DO HEREBY ORDER as follows:—

1. The maximum prices and charges to be charged, the records to be kept, and the notices to be displayed in the course of the businesses dealt with by the Orders of the Board of Trade set out in the First Schedule hereto, and in relation to the goods referred to in such Orders, ascertained in the manner specified in such Orders (the Orders being read together with any repeals, amendments or variations), shall be the maximum prices and charges which may be charged, the records which shall be kept, and the notices which shall be displayed in respect of such businesses and in relation to such goods in this Island.

2. The Orders set out in the first column of the Second Schedule hereto shall have effect subject to the omission from the respective Schedules thereto of the Orders of the Board of Trade set out in the second column of the Second Schedule hereto.

3. This Order may be cited as "The Goods and Services (Maximum Prices) (No. 86) Order, 1950" and shall come into force on the 15th day of March, 1950.
