THE IMPORT DUTIES (CONSOLIDATION) (ISLE OF MAN) ORDER 1950

His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor has made an Order (a copy of which is appended) under section 2 of the Isle of Man (Customs) (No. 2) Act, 1932, as extended by sub-section (4) of section 9 of the Isle of Man (Customs) Act, 1933, sections 12, 13 and 14 of the Isle of Man (Customs) Act, 1933, section 5 of the Isle of Man (Customs) Act, 1934, section 8 of the Isle of Man (Customs) Act, 1935, and section 3 of the Isle of Man (Customs) Act, 1939.

The Order is based on the Import Duties (Consolidation) Order, 1949, made by the Treasury on the 16th December, 1949.

THE IMPORT DUTIES (CONSOLIDATION) (ISLE OF MAN) ORDER 1950

WHEREAS the Treasury, by virtue of the powers conferred on them by the following enactments, that is to say, section three and sub-section (5) of section nineteen of the Import Duties Act, 1932, section fourteen and sub-section (3) of section sixteen of the Finance Act, 1933, sub-section (3) of section ten of the Finance Act, 1934, section eleven of the Finance Act, 1935, paragraph 12 of the Third Schedule to the Finance Act, 1939, and section one of the Import Duties (Emergency Provisions) Act, 1939, and by virtue of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, made an Order dated the 16th December, 1949, and entitled the Import Duties (Consolidation) Order, 1949.

NOW THEREFORE, I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, by virtue and in exercise of the powers conferred on me by section two of the Second Act of 1932 as extended by sub-section (4) of section nine of the Act of 1933, sections twelve, thirteen and fourteen of the Act of 1933, section five of the Act of 1934, section eight of the Act of 1935, and section three of the Act of 1939, do hereby make the following Order:—

1. (i) This Order may be cited as the Import Duties (Consolidation) (Isle of Man) Order, 1950.
- (ii) This Order shall come into operation on the 10th day of March, nineteen hundred and fifty.
- (iii) Reference to an Act of any year shall be deemed to be to the Isle of Man (Customs) Act of that year.

Revocation of previous Orders, etc.

2. (i) The following provisions are hereby revoked, that is to say:—
- (a) any order of the Governor so far as made under—
 - (i) sub-section one of section two of the Second Act of 1932 (which relates to additional import duties) ;
 - (ii) section twelve of the Act of 1933 (which relates to reductions of duty to give effect to commercial agreements) ;
 - (iii) section thirteen of the Act of 1933 (which relates to the substitution of a specific duty for the general ad valorem duty) ; or
 - (iv) section eight of the Act of 1935 (which relates to charging a reduced duty instead of the general ad valorem duty) ;
 - (b) Part I of the Second Schedule to the Act of 1939 (which relates to the duty on cinematograph film) in so far as it provides that references to the Import Duties (General) Order, 1935, are to be construed as references to that Order as amended by such parts of paragraph 1 of the Third Schedule to the Finance Act, 1939, as are revoked and by paragraph 4 of the said Third Schedule ; and paragraph 1 of Part II of the said Second Schedule ;
 - (c) any other order of the Governor so far as it varies any provision of the said Second Schedule or any such provision as is referred to in sub-paragraph (a) of this paragraph.
- (ii) The provisions revoked by this Article shall not be taken as including any Order of the Governor so far as made under—
- (a) sub-section 3 of section one of the Act of 1932 and section five of the Act of 1934 (which relates to exemptions from the General ad valorem duty) ; or
 - (b) sub-section (4) of section five of the Act of 1936 (which gives by reference to section two of the Second Act of 1932, power to impose additional duties under the Act of 1926) ; but shall include any order of the Governor so far as it provides for including in the Second Annex to the Import Duties (Exemption Consolidation) (Isle of Man) Order, 1936, any item not for the time being contained in the First Schedule to the Act of 1932, or for making in that Annex amendments consequential on the inclusion therein of any such item.
3. The provisions of the Import Duties (Consolidation) Order, 1949, made by the Treasury as aforesaid shall apply in relation to the importation into the Isle of Man of the classes and descriptions of goods referred to therein as they apply to the importation of such goods into the United Kingdom.
