THE PURCHASE TAX (ISLE OF MAN) (No. 5) ORDER, 1950.

His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor has made an Order (a copy of which is appended) under Section 37 of the Purchase Tax Act, 1949, amending Part I of the First Schedule to the Purchase Tax Act, 1949 (which sets out the classes of goods chargeable with purchase tax).

The Order brings into force a new list of drugs and medicines which are free of purchase tax. The list supersedes the existing list shown in the Purchase Tax (No. 3) Order, 1949, an Order made by the Treasury on the 12th August, 1949.

The Order shall be deemed to have come into operation on the 13th March, 1950.

THE PURCHASE TAX (ISLE OF MAN) (No. 5) ORDER, 1950.

I, the said Lieutenant Governor, by virtue of the powers conferred on me by sub-section (1) of Section 37 of the Purchase Tax Act, 1949, and all other powers enabling me in that behalf, DO hereby make the following Order:—

1.—(1) As from the commencement of this Order, Part I of the First Schedule to the Purchase Tax Act, 1949, as amended by the Purchase Tax (Isle of Man) (No. 2) Order 1949, shall have effect as if for the reference in paragraph (c) of Group 33 therein to the Schedule to the Purchase Tax (No. 3) Order, 1949 (an Order made by the Treasury on the 12th August, 1949), there were substituted a reference to the Schedule to the Purchase Tax (No. 6) Order, 1950 (an Order made by the Treasury on the 3rd March, 1950).

(2) The Purchase Tax (Isle of Man) (No. 2) Order, 1949 (Government Circular No. 187/49), is hereby revoked.

2.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Purchase Tax (Isle of Man) (No. 5) Order, 1950.

(2) The Interpretation Act, 1949, shall apply in the interpretation of this Order as it applies in the interpretation of an Act of Tynwald.

(3) This Order shall be deemed to have come into operation on the 13th day of March, 1950.
