

## **THE GOODS AND SERVICES (PRICE CONTROL) (No. 87) ORDER, 1950**

His Excellency the Deputy-Governor has made an Order under the Goods and Services (Price Control) Act, 1941, as extended to the Isle of Man by the Goods and Services (Price Control) (Isle of Man) Order, 1943, providing that the maximum prices and/or charges to be charged in the Isle of Man for

Utility Cloth and Utility Household Textiles  
Utility Handkerchiefs  
Sewing Cottons and Threads  
Utility Apparel

shall be the same as those fixed by Orders made by the Board of Trade.

Two Orders made by His Excellency (Nos. 30 and 68) are revoked. These Orders applied to the Isle of Man Orders of the Board of Trade which have since been revoked or replaced by new Orders.

The Order comes into force on the 11th day of April, 1950.

The Board of Trade Orders concerned are specified in the First Schedule to the Order, a copy of which is appended.

The Utility Cloth and Utility Household Textiles (Maximum Prices) (Amendment No. 7) Order, 1950, S.I. 1950 No. 298 (price 2d.) amends the Utility Cloth and Utility Household Textiles (Maximum Prices) Order, 1949, as amended, which fixes wholesalers' and retailers' maximum prices for utility cloth and utility household textiles by—

- (a) fixing increased maximum prices for the four descriptions of utility cotton quilt cloths included in the Fourth Schedule to the principal Order;
- (b) fixing new maximum prices for the six descriptions of utility rayon quilt cloths now added to that Schedule; maximum prices for these cloths are no longer to be computed by reference to price paid and the permitted margins;
- (c) bringing into force Related Schedule No. 5H (price 4d.) to replace Related Schedule No. 5G and Supplements Nos. 1, 2 and 3 thereto (utility household textiles); and
- (d) bringing into force Supplement No. 1 to Related Schedule No. 6N (price 2d.) (utility upholstery cloth and utility curtain cloth).

The Utility Handkerchiefs (Maximum Prices) (Amendment No. 4) Order, 1950, S.I. 1950 No. 302 (Price 2d.) amends the Utility Handkerchiefs (Maximum Prices) Order, 1947, by providing increased wholesalers' and retailers' maximum prices for utility cotton handkerchiefs described in the Schedule.

The Sewing Cottons and Threads (Maximum Prices) Order, 1950, S.I. 1950 No. 382 (price 2d.) supersedes the Sewing Cottons and Threads (Maximum Prices) Order, 1945, as amended. The principal changes are :—

- 1.—Maximum prices for four lines of cotton mendings have been increased.
- 2.—There is a new definition of " maximum price."

The Utility Apparel (Maximum Prices and Charges) Order, 1949, (Amendment No. 6) Order, 1950, S.I.1950 No. 397 (price 1d.) brings into force two new Related Schedules No. 5F (Industrial Overalls and Aprons) and No. 17 (Women's Domestic Overalls and Aprons) to replace Related Schedule No. 5E (Domestic and Industrial Overalls) and Supplements No. 1 and 2 thereto. Related Schedule No. 5F (price 6d.) contains revised ceiling prices for distributors which take into account the reductions in the percentage margins for wholesalers and retailers last September and the changes in the manufacturers' maximum prices which came into operation on February 6th. Related Schedule No. 17 (price 4d.) replaces Sections 1 and 2 of Part 1 of Related Schedule No. 5E (as amended). The ceiling prices are unchanged.

The Orders specified in the First Schedule to the Order may be seen or purchased at the Office of the Secretary of the Price Regulation Committee, 1. Hope Street, Douglas, or may be seen at any Police Station on application to the Officer in Charge, at the Douglas Public Library, the Douglas Town Hall, and the Offices of all the Town and Village Commissioners.

Failure to comply with the terms of the Order renders a person liable to prosecution.

**THE GOODS AND SERVICES (MAXIMUM PRICES) (No. 87)  
ORDER, 1950.**

---

WHEREAS the Board of Trade under the powers vested in them under the Goods and Services (Price Control) Act, 1941, have from time to time made Orders fixing the maximum prices and/or charges to be charged in the course of the businesses comprising the sale of goods and/or the performing of services in relation thereto, and requiring the keeping of records and the display of notices in respect of certain goods in the course of such businesses, and it is desirable that the prices and charges of such goods and services so fixed should be the maximum prices and charges to be charged and that such records should be kept and such notices displayed in respect of such businesses in the Isle of Man.

NOW I, the said Deputy-Governor, by virtue of the powers conferred on me by Sections 1, 2 and 18 of the Goods and Services (Price Control) Act, 1941, as extended to the Isle of Man by the Goods and Services (Price Control) (Isle of Man) Order in Council, 1943, and all other powers and authorities me in this behalf enabling, DO HEREBY ORDER as follows:—

1. The maximum prices and charges to be charged, the records to be kept, and the notices to be displayed in the course of the businesses dealt with by the Orders of the Board of Trade set out in the First Schedule hereto, and in relation to the goods referred to in such Orders, ascertained in the manner specified in such Orders (the Orders being read together with any repeals, amendments or variations), shall be the maximum prices and charges which may be charged, the records which shall be kept, and the notices which shall be displayed in respect of such businesses and in relation to such goods in this Island.

2. The Orders set out in the Second Schedule hereto are hereby revoked.

3. This Order may be cited as "The Goods and Services (Maximum Prices) (No. 87) Order, 1950" and shall come into force on the 11th day of April, 1950.
