**THE DRIED FRUITS ORDER, 1950**

This amending Order releases from control dried figs (other than imported pressed figs pre-packed in the country of origin, which have already been released).

The Order comes into force on the 9th April 1950.

Copies of the Order may be obtained at Government Office or may be seen at any Police Station on application to the Officer in Charge, at the Douglas Public Library, the Douglas Town Hall and the Offices of all the Town and Village Commissioners.

**THE DRIED FRUITS ORDER, 1950**

---

I, the said Deputy Governor in exercise of the powers conferred upon me by Regulations 55 and 98 of the Defence (General) Regulations (Isle of Man) 1939, as having effect by virtue of the Supplies and Services (Transitional Powers) (Isle of Man) Order in Council, 1946, as extended by the Supplies and Services (Extended Purposes) (Isle of Man) Order in Council, 1948, DO hereby make the following Order:—

1. The Dried Fruits Order, 1949, shall be amended by deleting in Group B of Part II of the First Schedule thereto the item relating to Figs (other than imported pressed figs pre-packed in the country of origin).

2. This Order shall come into operation on the 9th day of April, 1950, and may be cited as The Dried Fruits Order, 1950.
