**THE FOODS AND SOAP (REGULATION OF
EXPORTATION) ORDER, 1950.**

His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor has made the above-styled Order, a copy of which is appended, further amending The Foods and Soap (Regulation of Exportation) Order, 1948 (a).

The effect of this amending Order is to remove certain items including canned meat and canned meat products, canned milk and canned beans which are not now subject to the provisions of the points Rationing Orders.

The Order comes into force on the 25th April, 1950.

Copies of the Order may be obtained at Government Office, or may be seen at any Police Station on application to the Officer in Charge, at the Douglas Public Library, the Douglas Town Hall, and the Offices of all the Town and Village Commissioners.

THE FOODS AND SOAP (REGULATION
OF EXPORTATION) ORDER, 1950.

I, the said Lieutenant Governor, in exercise of the powers conferred upon me by Regulations 55, 55AA and 98 of the Defence (General) Regulations (Isle of Man) 1939, as having effect by virtue of the Supplies and Services (Transitional Powers) (Isle of Man) Order in Council, 1946, as extended by the Supplies and Services (Extended Purposes) (Isle of Man) Order in Council, 1948, DO hereby make the following Order:—

1. The Foods and Soap (Regulation of Exportation) Order, 1948, as amended, shall be further amended by substituting for the Schedule thereto the Schedule to this Order.

2. The Foods and Soap (Regulation of Exportation) (No. 2) Order, 1949, dated the 3rd December, 1949, is hereby revoked but without prejudice to any proceedings in respect of any contravention thereof.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the 25th day of April, 1950, and may be cited as The Foods and Soap (Regulation of Exportation) Order, 1950.

T H E S C H E D U L E

Meat (Cooked or Uncooked) and Meat Products.

Tea.

Butter.

Margarine.

Cooking Fats (which includes any fat or mixture of oils and fats fit for human food or for use in the manufacture, preparation or treatment of human food, having a melting point which when determined by the method specified in the Second Schedule to the Oils and Fats Order, 1949, is not less than 30 degrees centigrade).

Suet (other than Shredded Suet in packets).

Oils, Fats and Mixtures as specified in Parts I and III of the First Schedule to the Oils and Fats Order, 1949.

Bacon.

Ham.

Sugar.

Manufactured products containing sugar.

Mincemeat.

Cheese (other than Parmesan, Imported Blue Vein, Stilton, Blue Cheshire, Pont l'Eveque, Carre de l'Est, Camembert, Brie, Swiss Emmenthal, Petit Gruyere, Fromage Demi-Sel, Saint Paulin Cheese, Scandinavian Primula cheeses, Italian full cream soft cheese, soft cheese, curd cheese, lactic cheese, and cheese made from milk other than cow's milk).

Eggs.

Imported Canned Fruits as follows—mandarin oranges, grape fruit, apricots, peaches (other than peaches in water or slightly sweetened water), pears, fruitcocktail, two fruits, fruit salad and pineapple.

Imported Canned Fish as follows—salmon, crab, crawfish (crayfish), sardines, pilchards, brisling (sild), tunny (tuna).

Dried Fruits (other than figs, dried plums or prunes and dates).

Rice.

Biscuits wholly covered with chocolate and any other sweet or semi-sweet biscuits, other than rusks, and biscuits partly covered with chocolate.

Bananas.

Poultry.

Flour.

Tomatoes.

Potatoes (other than "early" potatoes).

Soap (other than shaving, abrasive, liquid and dental soap).

Syrup and Treacle.

"canned" in relation to any food means packed in an airtight metal container by any means involving the application of heat, whether before, during or after the placing of the food in the container, and includes any such food which having been so packed has been removed from such container.

"imported" means imported into the United Kingdom and subsequently imported into the Isle of Man, or imported directly into the Isle of Man.
