THE FOOD (REGULATION OF IMPORTATION) ORDER, 1950

His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor has made the above-styled Order, a copy of which is appended, further amending the Food (Regulation of Importation) Order, 1948 (a), by substituting a new Schedule for the existing Schedule.

In the new Schedule certain items are removed including canned meat and meat products, canned milk, canned beans and shredded suet which are not now subject to the Points Rationing Orders.

Copies of the Order may be obtained at Government Office, or may be seen at any Police Station on application to the Officer in Charge, at the Douglas Public Library, the Douglas Town Hall, and the Offices of all the Town and Village Commissioners.

THE FOOD (REGULATION OF IMPORTATION) ORDER, 1950

I, the said Lieutenant Governor, in exercise of the powers conferred upon me by Regulations 55, 55AA and 98 of the Defence (General) Regulations (Isle of Man) 1939, as having effect by virtue of the Supplies and Services (Transitional Powers) (Isle of Man) Order in Council, 1946, as extended by the Supplies and Services (Extended Purposes) (Isle of Man) Order in Council, 1948, DO hereby make the following Order:—

1. The Food (Regulation of Importation) Order, 1948, as amended, shall be further amended by substituting for the Schedule thereto the Schedule to this Order.

2. The Food (Regulation of Importation) (No. 3) Order, 1949, dated the 3rd December, 1949, is hereby revoked but without prejudice to any proceedings in respect of any contravention thereof.

3. This Order may be cited as The Food (Regulation of Importation) Order, 1950, and shall come into force on the 25th day of April, 1950.

THE SCHEDULE

Milk Powder (which means milk which has been concentrated to the form of powder or solid by the removal of water).

Imported Canned Fruits as follows:—Mandarin oranges, grapefruit, apricots, peaches (other than peaches in water or slightly sweetened water), pears, fruit-cocktail, two fruits, fruit salad, and pineapple.

Imported Canned Fish as follows:—Salmon, crab, crawfish (crayfish), sardines, pilchards, brisling (sild), tunny (tuna).

Dried Fruits (other than figs, dried plums or prunes and dates).

Mincemeat.

Rice.

Biscuits wholly covered with chocolate and any other sweet or semi-sweet biscuits, other than rusks, and biscuits partly covered with chocolate.

Table Jellies (Tablets, compounds or crystals).

Tea.

Butter.

Margarine.

Cooking Fats (which includes any fat or mixture of oils and fats fit for human food or for use in the manufacture, preparation or treatment of human food, having a melting point which when determined by the method specified in the Fourth Schedule to the Oils and Fats Order, 1949, is not less than 30 degrees centigrade, and for the purpose of this Order shall include lard).

Oils, fats and mixtures specified in Parts I and III of the First Schedule to the Oils and Fats Order, 1949.

Bacon.

Ham.

Sugar.

Syrup.

Treacle.

Cheese (other than Parmesan, Imported Blue Vein, Stilton, Blue Cheshire, Pont l'Eveque, Carre de l'Est, Camembert, Brie, Swiss Emmenthal, Petit Gruyere, Fromage Demisel, Saint Paulin, Scandinavian Primula Cheeses, Italian full cream soft cheese, soft cheese, curd cheese, lactic cheese, and cheese made from milk other than cow's milk).

Eggs.

Ice Cream (including water ices and any commodity whether frozen or chilled and under whatever description it is sold which is substantially similar to or may be used as a substitute for ice cream or calculated to lead to the belief that the commodity sold is ice cream).

Flour.

Live Poultry.

For the purposes of this Schedule—

“canned” in relation to any food means packed in an airtight metal container by any means involving the application of heat, whether before, during or after the placing of the food in the container, and includes any such food which having been so packed has been removed from such container.

“imported” means imported into the United Kingdom and subsequently imported into the Isle of Man, or imported directly into the Isle of Man.
