SUPPLIES AND SERVICES.

THE BACON (RATIONING) (No. 2) ORDER, 1950

His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor has made the above-styled Order, a copy of which is appended, further amending the Bacon Rationing Order, 1949 (a).

This amending Order, as from 23rd April, 1950, reduces by 1 oz. per week, to 4 ozs., the amount of the Bacon Ration which may be obtained on a General Ration Book R.B.1, a Junior Ration Book R.B.4, a Child's Ration Book R.B.2, a Form R.B. 12, and a Duty Ration Card R.B.8R. Appropriate coupons in these ration documents valid for use during the week beginning 16th April, 1950, and the following week, but not used in the week beginning 16th April, 1950, remain valid, if used in the week beginning 23rd April, 1950, for 5 ozs.

Copies of the Order may be obtained at Government Office, or may be seen at any Police Station on application to the Officer in Charge, at the Douglas Public Library, the Douglas Town Hall, and the Offices of all the Town and Village Commissioners.

Failure to comply with the terms of the Order renders a person liable to the penalties imposed by the Defence Regulations.

SUPPLIES AND SERVICES.

THE BACON (RATIONING) (No. 2) ORDER, 1950.

I, the said Lieutenant Governor, in exercise of the powers conferred upon me by Regulations 55 and 98 of the Defence (General) Regulations (Isle of Man), 1939, as having effect by virtue of the Supplies and Services (Transitional Powers) (Isle of Man) Order in Council, 1946, as extended by the Supplies and Services (Extended Purposes) (Isle of Man) Order in Council, 1948, DO hereby make the following Order:—

1. The Bacon Rationing Order, 1949, as amended, shall be further amended by substituting in the 2nd column of the Schedule thereto (which specifies the amount of the bacon ration) for the amount of "5 oz." in relation to each appropriate coupon in a General Ration Book R.B.1, a Junior Ration Book R.B.4, a Child's Ration Book R.B.2, a Form R.B.12 and a Duty Ration Card R.B.8R the amount "4 oz."

2. Notwithstanding anything contained in Article 1 of this Order, the maximum amount of bacon which may be obtained or supplied against an appropriate coupon for bacon in any of the ration documents mentioned in Article 1 of this Order relating to the week beginning 16th April, 1950, and valid for use during the said week and the following week, but not used during the said week beginning 16th April, 1950, shall be 5 oz. net.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the 23rd day of April, 1950, and may be cited as the Bacon (Rationing) (No. 2) Order, 1950.
