THE COFFEE ORDER, 1950

His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor has made the above-styled Order, a copy of which is appended, further amending the Coffee (Maximum Retail Prices) Order, 1946 (a).

This Order :—

- (1) raises the lowest maximum retail price of raw coffee by sevenpence a pound;
- (2) raises the lowest maximum retail price of roasted coffee and coffee mixture by sevenpence a pound, and by eightpence if it is sold in quarter-pound or smaller packets; and
- (3) raises all other maximum retail prices of raw coffee, roasted coffee and coffee mixture by sixpence a pound.

Examples of the new prices are :—

½lb. tin of roasted coffee	1s. 11d.
½lb. of roasted coffee sold loose ranging from.....	1s. 2½d. to 1s. 8d.
½lb. tin of coffee mixture	1s. 9d.
½lb. of coffee mixture sold loose ranging from.....	1s. 2½d. to 1s. 6d.

The Order comes into force on the 7th May, 1950.

Copies of the Order may be obtained at Government Office, or may be seen at any Police Station on application to the Officer in Charge, at the Douglas Public Library, the Douglas Town Hall, and the Offices of all the Town and Village Commissioners.

Failure to comply with the terms of the Order renders a person liable to the penalties imposed by the Defence Regulations.

THE COFFEE ORDER, 1950

I, the said Lieutenant Governor, in exercise of the powers conferred upon me by Regulations 55 and 98 of the Defence (General) Regulations (Isle of Man), 1939, as having effect by virtue of the Supplies and Services (Transitional Powers) (Isle of Man) Order in Council, 1946, as extended by the Supplies and Services (Extended Purposes) (Isle of Man) Order in Council, 1948, DO hereby make the following Order :

1. The Coffee (Maximum Retail Prices) Order, 1946, as amended shall be further amended as follows :—

(a) by substituting for paragraph (1) of Article 2 thereof the following paragraph :—

“(1) No person shall buy or sell coffee by retail at a price exceeding a price calculated at the rate of :—

(a) 2s. 6d. per lb. for roasted coffee or coffee mixture when packed in containers containing not more than $\frac{1}{2}$ lb each;

(b) 2s. 5d. per lb. for roasted coffee or coffee mixture, when packed in containers containing more than $\frac{1}{2}$ lb. each; or

(c) 2s. 3d. per lb. for raw coffee (other than coffee mixture):

Provided that any person may buy or sell coffee by retail at a price exceeding the above prices, but not exceeding the price applicable in accordance with Part I of the Schedule to this Order, if the appropriate condition in Part II of the said Schedule is complied with.”;

(b) by substituting for Part I of the Schedule thereto the Schedule to this Order;

(c) by substituting for the words “1s. 10d. per lb.” in sub-paragraph (a) and in sub-paragraph (b) of paragraph I of Part II of the Schedule thereto the words “2s. 5d. per lb. (or 2s. 6d. per lb. if packed in containers containing not more than $\frac{1}{2}$ lb each)”; and

(d) by substituting for the words “1s. 8d. per lb.” in sub-paragraph (a) and in sub-paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 of Part II of the Schedule thereto the words “2s. 3d. per lb.”.

2. The Coffee (Maximum Retail Prices) Order, 1947, and the Coffee Order, 1949, are hereby revoked, but without prejudice to any proceedings in respect of any contravention of the Coffee (Maximum Retail Prices) Order, 1946, as amended by either of the said Orders.

3. This Order may be cited as the Coffee Order, 1950, and shall come into operation on the 7th day of May, 1950.

THE SCHEDULE

(To be substituted for Part I of the Schedule to the Coffee (Maximum Retail Prices) Order, 1946).

PART I.

MAXIMUM RETAIL PRICE OF COFFEE WHEN THE CONDITIONS IN PART II ARE COMPLIED WITH.

The maximum retail price of coffee when the appropriate condition in Part II of this Schedule is complied with shall be in accordance with the following table:—

	Per lb. s. d.
1. Roasted coffee (not including coffee mixture)—	
(a) pre-packed in a container made of metal or glass containing not more than 1 lb. of coffee	3 10
(b) pre-packed in a sealed, airtight, film-lined container (lined otherwise than with a cellulose-based film) capable of being gas-packed containing—	
(i) not more than $\frac{1}{4}$ lb. of coffee	3 8
(ii) not more than $\frac{1}{2}$ lb. of coffee	3 7
(iii) not more than 1 lb. of coffee	3 6
(c) not pre-packed as aforesaid	3 4
2. Coffee mixture—	
(a) pre-packed in a container made of metal or glass containing not more than 1 lb. of coffee	3 6
(b) pre-packed in a sealed, airtight, film-lined container (lined otherwise than with a cellulose-based film) capable of being gas-packed containing—	
(i) not more than $\frac{1}{4}$ lb. of coffee	3 4
(ii) not more than $\frac{1}{2}$ lb. of coffee	3 3
(iii) not more than 1 lb. of coffee	3 2
(c) not pre-packed as aforesaid	3 0
3. Raw coffee	3 2

For the purposes of the above table, “pre-packed” means packed in advance ready for retail sale.
