THE PURCHASE TAX (ISLE OF MAN) (No. 7) ORDER, 1950.

---

His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor has made an Order (a copy of which is appended) under Section 37 of the Purchase Tax Act, 1949, amending Section 24 of the Purchase Tax Act, 1949.

The Order provides that the temporary exemption provided for War Memorials by Section 24 of the Purchase Tax Act, 1949, shall be continued until the 19th December, 1955, and extended so as to cover cases where the charge of tax arises on importation or by application of a chargeable process.

THE PURCHASE TAX (ISLE OF MAN) (No. 7) ORDER, 1950.

I, the said Lieutenant Governor, by virtue of the powers conferred on me by sub-section (1) of Section 37 of the Purchase Tax Act, 1949, and all other powers enabling me in that behalf DO hereby make the following Order :—

1. For Section 24 of the Purchase Tax Act, 1949, the following Section shall be substituted :—

“ 24. Subject to such conditions as they may impose for the protection of the revenue, the Commissioners, upon an application in that behalf made to them before the twentieth day of December, nineteen hundred and fifty-five, may remit purchase tax chargeable in respect of an article of furniture, plate or textile material or an ornament, if they are satisfied that the purchase, importation or other act by virtue of which the tax is chargeable was made or done for the purpose of placing the article or ornament in a place of religious worship as a war memorial and that it will be retained therein.”

2.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Purchase Tax (Isle of Man) (No. 7) Order, 1950.

(2) The Interpretation Act, 1949, shall apply in the interpretation of this Order as it applies in the interpretation of an Act of Tynwald.
