His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor has issued a Proclamation (under the Bankers' Act, 1872), a copy of which is appended, appointing Friday, the 9th June, 1950, to be observed as a Bank Holiday in the Island, in place of Thursday, the 8th June, 1950.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS, by Section 5 of the Bankers' Act, 1872, it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor by Proclamation from time to time, when it is made to appear to the Governor in any special case, that in any year it is inexpedient that a day by the said Act appointed for a Bank Holiday should be a Bank Holiday, to declare that such day shall not in such year be a Bank Holiday, and to appoint such other day as to the Governor may seem fit to be a Bank Holiday instead of such day, and thereupon the day so appointed by the Governor shall in such year be substituted for the day so appointed by the said Act.

AND WHEREAS the day upon which the reigning Sovereign shall direct that his birthday shall be celebrated at all home stations is a Bank Holiday.

AND WHEREAS His Majesty has directed that His Birthday shall be celebrated in 1950 at all Stations both at Home and Abroad, on Thursday, the 8th June, 1950.

AND WHEREAS it has been made to appear to me that it is inexpedient that the 8th June, 1950, should be observed as a Bank Holiday.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, the said Lieutenant Governor, by virtue of the power and authority in me vested as aforesaid, do hereby declare that the 8th day of June, 1950, shall not be a Bank Holiday, and I hereby appoint Friday, the 9th day of June, 1950, to be observed as a Bank Holiday throughout this Isle in the place of the 8th day of June, 1950.
