**SUPPLIES AND SERVICES.**

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**THE MEALS IN ESTABLISHMENTS  
ORDER, 1950.**

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His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor has made the above-styled Order, a copy of which is appended, requiring catering establishments supplying meals to non-residents—

- (a) to exhibit price lists containing complete lists of meals and dishes offered and the prices charged therefor, and
- (b) in the case of any room in which only complete breakfasts, luncheons, or dinners are served at an inclusive price for such a meal to display notices to that effect.

“Catering Establishments” means any hotel, boarding house, restaurant, cafe, tea shop, coffee stall, inn or public house serving food, and every other place of refreshment open to the public.

The Order comes into force on the 14th May, 1950.

Copies of the Order may be obtained at Government Office, or may be seen at any Police Station on application to the Officer in Charge, at the Douglas Public Library, the Douglas Town Hall, and the Offices of all the Town and Village Commissioners.

Failure to comply with the terms of the Order renders a person liable to the penalties imposed by the Defence Regulations.

**SUPPLIES AND SERVICES.**

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**THE MEALS IN ESTABLISHMENTS ORDER, 1950.**

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I, the said Lieutenant Governor, in exercise of the power conferred upon me by Regulations 55 and 98 of the Defence (General) Regulations (Isle of Man), 1939, as having effect by virtue of the Supplies and Services (Transitional Powers) (Isle of Man) Order in Council, 1946, as extended by the Supplies and Services (Extended Purposes) (Isle of Man) Order in Council, 1948, DO hereby make the following Order:—

1. In this Order—

“Catering Establishments” means any hotel, boarding house, restaurant, café, tea shop, coffee stall, inn or public house serving food, and every other place of refreshment open to the public.

2. (1) Every catering establishment supplying meals to non-residents shall exhibit in prominent places near to the entrance of such establishment and on the walls of any room in which meals are served a price list containing a complete list of meals and dishes offered in the establishment and the prices charged for such meals and dishes. The letters and figures on such price list shall be in block letters and figures not less than half an inch long and distinctly legible.

(2) In the case of any room in any catering establishment in which only complete breakfasts, luncheons or dinners, are served to non-residents at an inclusive price for such a meal, a notice to that effect stating the price shall be prominently displayed at the entrance and on the walls of the room of such establishment. The letters and figures on such notice shall be in block letters and figures not less than half an inch long and distinctly legible.

3. This Order shall come into force on the 14th day of May, 1950, and may be cited as The Meals in Establishments Order, 1950.
