The Dangerous Goods Act, 1928, The Dangerous Goods Order, 1950

His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor has made the above-styled Order amending the Dangerous Goods Order, 1928. The effect of the amendment is to permit of the packing of explosives in fibreboard cases constructed in accordance with a Home Office specification.

The 1928 Order required explosives to be packed in wooden cases, boxes or barrels, and this amendment is necessitated by the present stringency in timber supplies.

The Order was approved by Tynwald on the 23rd day of July, 1950.

THE DANGEROUS GOODS ACT, 1928.

THE DANGEROUS GOODS ORDER, 1950.

I, the said Lieutenant Governor, in exercise of the power and authority in me vested by Section 4 of the Dangerous Goods Act, 1928 and of all other powers in this behalf enabling, DO hereby Order and make the following regulations:—
G.O. Reference No. 26042/13.

1. The Dangerous Goods Order, 1928, shall be amended as follows:—

- (a) by the insertion of the following definition of “fibreboard case” after the definition of “Explosives” in Article 3 of the Order—
“fibreboard case” means a case constructed in accordance with the provisions of ‘Special Packing Authority No. 1194’ issued by the Home Office on 16th February, 1950.”
- (b) by the insertion of the words “or fibreboard cases” after the words “wooden boxes or barrels” in Article 25 of the Order.
- (c) by the insertion of the words “or fibreboard case” after the words “or box” in paragraph 6 of the Second Schedule to the Order.

2. This Order may be cited as the Dangerous Goods Order, 1950, and shall be construed as one with the Dangerous Goods Orders, 1928 to 1937, and such Orders and this Order may be together cited as the Dangerous Goods Orders, 1928 to 1950. This Order shall take effect when approved by resolution of Tynwald.
