

THE MATRIMONIAL CAUSES (WAR MARRIAGES) (APPOINTED DAY) ORDER, 1950

This Order appoints the day which marks the end of the period during which a marriage must have been celebrated in order to give the High Court of Justice of the Isle of Man jurisdiction to entertain matrimonial proceedings. The day also marks the beginning of the period of five years after which no proceedings under the Act for divorce or nullity of marriage may be commenced in the Isle of Man.

THE MATRIMONIAL CAUSES (WAR MARRIAGES) (APPOINTED DAY) ORDER, 1950

Whereas by section two of the Matrimonial Causes (War Marriages) Act, 1946 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), it is provided that in the Act the expression "the appointed day" means such day as the Governor by Order in Council appoints.

Now, therefore, I, the said Lieutenant Governor, in pursuance of the said section two, am pleased, by and with the advice of the Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

- 1.—For the purposes of the Act the appointed day shall be the first day of June, nineteen hundred and fifty.
2. This Order may be cited as the Matrimonial Causes (War Marriages) (Appointed Day) Order, 1950.
