(SUPPLIES AND SERVICES)

THE MEALS IN ESTABLISHMENTS (No. 2) ORDER, 1950.

His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor has made the above-styled Order, a copy of which is appended, requiring catering establishments supplying meals to non-residents—

- (a) to keep posted up at or near to the entrance of such establishment and in a conspicuous position so as to be clearly legible to all customers, a list stating in clear words and figures, the meals and dishes offered in the establishment and the respective prices charged for such meals and dishes; and
- (b) in any room where such meals are served have available and produce to customers on request a list or menu containing similar information.

“Catering Establishment” means any hotel, boarding house, restaurant, cafe, tea shop, coffee stall, inn or public house serving food, and every other place of refreshment open to the public.

This Order which revokes the Meals in Establishments Order, 1950, comes into force on the 2nd June, 1950.

Copies of the Order may be obtained at Government Office or may be seen at any Police Station on application to the Officer in Charge, at the Douglas Public Library, the Douglas Town Hall and the Offices of all the Town and Village Commissioners.

Failure to comply with the terms of the Order renders a person liable to the penalties imposed by the Defence Regulations.

THE MEALS IN ESTABLISHMENTS (No. 2) ORDER, 1950.

I, the said Lieutenant Governor, in exercise of the powers conferred upon me by Regulations 55 and 98 of the Defence (General) Regulations (Isle of Man), 1939, as having effect by virtue of the Supplies and Services (Transitional Powers) (Isle of Man) Order in Council, 1946, as extended by the Supplies and Services (Extended Purposes) (Isle of Man) Order in Council, 1948, DO hereby make the following Order:—

1.—In this Order—

“Catering Establishment” means any hotel, boarding house, restaurant, cafe, tea shop, coffee stall, inn or public house serving food, and every other place of refreshment open to the public.

2.—Every catering establishment supplying meals to non-residents shall—

(a) keep posted up at or near to the entrance of such establishment and in a conspicuous position so as to be clearly legible to all customers, a list stating in clear words and figures, the meals and dishes offered in the establishment and the respective prices charged for such meals and dishes; and

(b) in any room where such meals are served have available and produce to customers on request a list or menu containing similar information.

3.—The Meals in Establishments Order, 1950, is hereby revoked.

4.—This Order shall come into force on the 2nd day of June, 1950, and may be cited as The Meals in Establishments (No. 2) Order, 1950.
