SUPPLIES AND SERVICES.

THE BEER (DISPLAY OF PRICES) ORDER, 1950.

I, the said Lieutenant Governor, in exercise of the powers conferred on me by Regulation 55 of the Defence (General) Regulations (Isle of Man), 1939, as having effect by virtue of the Supplies and Services (Transitional Powers) (Isle of Man) Order in Council, 1946, as extended by the Supplies and Services (Extended Purposes) (Isle of Man) Order in Council, 1948, DO hereby Order as follows:—

1. Every person holding a public house licence or an occasional public house licence under the Licensing Consolidation Act, 1949, shall—
 - (a) keep posted up in the vaults, bars, smoke rooms and lounges of the licensed premises, in a conspicuous position so as to be clearly legible to all customers, a list stating in clear words and figures, the prices charged in that part of the licensed premises for intoxicating liquor (other than liqueurs or wines); and
 - (b) in the dining room have available and shall produce to customers on request, a list stating in clear words and figures the prices charged in such dining room for intoxicating liquor.
2. This Order may be cited as the Beer (Display of Prices) Order, 1950, and shall come into force on the date hereof.
