**THE IMPORT DUTIES (EXEMPTIONS) (NO. 3)
(ISLE OF MAN) ORDER, 1950**

His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor has made an Order (a copy of which is appended) under section 1 of the Isle of Man (Customs) Act, 1932, and section 5 of the Isle of Man (Customs) Act, 1934, directing that the goods specified in such Order shall be added to the First Schedule to the Isle of Man (Customs) Act, 1932, and that the said Schedule as amended by the Import Duties (Exemptions Consolidation) (Isle of Man) Order, 1936, and by subsequent Orders shall be further amended.

**THE IMPORT DUTIES (EXEMPTIONS) (NO. 3) (ISLE OF MAN)
ORDER, 1950.**

WHEREAS the Treasury has by Order (No. 3) dated the 30th day of May, 1950, made under Sections 1 and 19 of the Import Duties Act, 1932, Section 10 of the Finance Act, 1934, and Section 1 of the Import Duties (Emergency Provisions) Act, 1939, ordered that the goods specified in such Order shall be added to the First Schedule to the Import Duties Act, 1932, and that the said First Schedule, as amended by the Import Duties (Exemptions Consolidation) Order, 1935, and by subsequent Orders, shall be further amended

NOW, THEREFORE, I the said Lieutenant Governor, by virtue of the powers conferred on me by Section 1 of the Isle of Man (Customs) Act, 1932, and Section 5 of the Isle of Man (Customs) Act, 1934, and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf, make the following Order :—

1. Oxidised rosin shall be added to the First Schedule to the Isle of Man (Customs) Act, 1932 (hereinafter referred to as “the Exemptions Schedule”).

2. Accordingly in the Exemptions Schedule, as amended by the Import Duties (Exemptions Consolidation) (Isle of Man) Order, 1936, and by subsequent Orders, and in the Second Annex to the said Order of 1936 as amended by subsequent Orders, for the heading—

“(a) Rosin (colophony); rosin (colophony), hydrogenated; and rosin (colophony), polymerised,”
in subparagraph (iv) of paragraph (2) of Group X there shall be substituted the heading:—

“(a) Rosin (colophony), including hydrogenated or polymerised rosin; rosin (oxidised).”

3. This Order may be cited as the Import Duties (Exemptions) (Isle of Man) (No. 3) Order, 1950.

4. This Order shall come into operation on the 8th day of June, 1950.
