

SUPPLIES AND SERVICES (TRANSITIONAL POWERS)

THE IMPORTED OATS (MAXIMUM PRICES) ORDER, 1950.

His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor has, under the powers vested in him by the Defence Regulations, made the above-styled Order, dated the 20th June, 1950 (a copy of which is appended), fixing a maximum price of 26s. 3d. per cwt. for imported oats.

The Order, which operates from the 20th June, 1950, until the 30th September, 1950, defines "imported oats" as threshed oats grown outside the Isle of Man.

Failure to comply with the terms of the Order renders a person liable to the penalties imposed by the Defence Regulations.

SUPPLIES AND SERVICES (TRANSITIONAL POWERS)

THE IMPORTED OATS (MAXIMUM PRICES) ORDER, 1950.

I, the said Lieutenant Governor, in exercise of the powers conferred on me by Regulations 55, 55AA and 98 of the Defence (General) Regulations (Isle of Man), 1939, as having effect by virtue of the Supplies and Services (Transitional Powers) (Isle of Man) Order in Council, 1946, as extended by the Supplies and Services (Extended Purposes) (Isle of Man) Order in Council, 1948, DO HEREBY ORDER as follows:—

1. In this Order—

"Approved buyer" means a person licensed as such by or on behalf of the Lieutenant Governor, for the purposes of the Oats and Barley (General Provisions) Order, 1949.

"Imported Oats" means threshed oats grown outside the Isle of Man.

2. No approved buyer shall sell or offer or agree to sell, any imported oats at a price exceeding 26s. 3d. per cwt.; such price shall include the cost of delivery and hire charges for returnable sacks and no charge shall be made in addition to such price in connection with the sale of any consignment of imported oats.

3. No person shall in connection with the sale or disposition of any imported oats, enter or offer to enter into any artificial or fictitious transaction or make or demand any unreasonable charge.

4. Infringements of this Order are offences against the Defence (General) Regulations (Isle of Man), 1939.

5. This Order may be cited as "The Imported Oats (Maximum Prices) Order, 1950," and shall operate from the date hereof until the 30th day of September, 1950.
