SUPPLIES AND SERVICES

The Dried Fruits (No. 2) Order, 1950.

I, the said Lieutenant Governor in exercise of the powers conferred upon me by Regulations 55, 55AA and 98 of the Defence (General) Regulations (Isle of Man), 1939, as having effect by virtue of the Supplies and Services (Transitional Powers) (Isle of Man) Order in Council, 1946, as extended by the Supplies and Services (Extended Purposes) (Isle of Man) Order in Council, 1948. DO hereby make the following Order:—

1. The Dried Fruits Order, 1949, as amended shall be further amended as follows:—

- (a) by deleting from Article 1 thereof the definition of date paste and the expression "(vii) Date paste." in the definition of excepted product;
- (b) by deleting Article 3 thereof;
- (c) by substituting for Part II of the First Schedule thereto the Schedule to this Order;
- (d) by substituting for paragraph 3 of the Second Schedule thereto the following paragraph—

"3. Prepacking

No addition shall be made to the maximum prices on any sale of dried fruit in respect of packing";

- (e) by deleting paragraph 5 of the Second Schedule.

2. The Dried Fruits Order, 1950 is hereby revoked but without prejudice to any proceedings in respect of any contravention of the Dried Fruits Order, 1949, as amended thereby.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the 2nd day of July, 1950, and may be cited as the Dried Fruits (No. 2) Order, 1950.
