**THE CONTROL OF PAPER
(CONTENTS POSTERS) ORDER, 1950**

The above-styled Order made by His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor supersedes the Control of Paper (Economy) Order, 1949, and an amending Order.

The Order repeats the provisions relating to contents posters.

There is no longer any restriction on the distribution of advertising circulars in the Isle of Man.

**THE CONTROL OF PAPER (CONTENTS POSTERS)
ORDER, 1950.**

I, the said Lieutenant Governor, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by Regulation 55 of the Defence (General) Regulations (Isle of Man), 1939, as having effect by virtue of the Supplies and Services (Transitional Powers) (Isle of Man) Order in Council, 1946, as extended by the Supplies and Services (Extended Purposes) (Isle of Man) Order in Council, 1948, DO hereby Order as follows:—

1. Except under the authority of a licence granted by or on behalf of the Governor hereunder and in accordance with any conditions attaching thereto, no person shall print or cause to be printed any contents poster, or exhibit or cause to be exhibited any printed contents poster.

2. (1) In this Order—

“contents poster” means a notice composed of or containing paper the purpose of which is to indicate to the public any current or topical matter, or single feature, appearing in one particular issue of a newspaper, magazine, periodical or news bulletin, but does not include a notice the purpose of which is to indicate to the public any permanent or regular or recurring matter or feature appearing in a series of issues of a newspaper, magazine, periodical or news bulletin;

“paper” includes all descriptions (whether homogeneous or laminated and whether coated or uncoated) of paper, paper-board, pulpboard, wall-board, fibreboard and other similar materials which are manufactured wholly or mainly either from vegetable fibres or a pulp thereof or both from such fibres and such pulp;

“print” includes printing by means of any duplicating or silk screen process and “printed” shall be construed accordingly.

(2) The Control of Paper (Economy) Order, 1949, and the Control of Paper (Economy) (Amendment) Order, 1950, are hereby revoked.

3. This Order may be cited as the Control of Paper (Contents Posters) Order, 1950, and shall come into operation on the date hereof.
