## WOOL (1950) CLIP.

Wool of the 1950 clip will, as from the 10th July, 1950, be purchased by the Treasurer of the Isle of Man in accordance with the following conditions :—

The Wool, accompanied by a declaration signed by the farmer that the wool is of the 1950 clip, must be delivered to the Government Wool Depot, Drill Hall, Douglas (Mondays to Fridays between the hours of 10 a.m. and 12 noon and 2 p.m. and 4 p.m., Saturdays between the hours of 10 a.m. and 12 noon), or to one of the following authorised collectors, and to dispose of the wool collected only to the Treasurer—

Before effecting delivery to the Government Wool Depot, Drill Hall, Douglas, arrangements should be made with the Government Valuer for its acceptance.

The maximum amounts payable for good, clean, light greasy farmers' ungraded clips delivered into the Depot, will be at the following rates in pence per lb.

Intermediate, inferior or heavy in grease or sand, dipstained or dip-tinted, the rate will be in proportion.

Until further notice an addition will be made to the Schedule of prices in respect of wool not taken up before 1st September, 1950, provided there is no delay on the part of the Farmer or Collector in complying with any directions given by the Government Valuer this addition will be at the rate of  $3\frac{1}{2}$  per cent. per annum from the 1st September, 1950, to date of taking up.

Payments will be made by the Treasurer of the Isle of Man to the Farmer or Collector as the case may be for wool delivered at the Government Depot immediately after inspection by the Government Valuer; payment will similarly be made by the collectors in respect of wools received by them from farmers.

Local Mills must apply for supplies of wool required to the Government Wool Depot, Drill Hall, Douglas, where the sale prices can be obtained
