The Game Amendment Act, 1942.

The Game Order, 1950.

The above-styled Order made by His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor extends the period during which rabbits or vermin may be hunted at night to include the month of September. The period is now 1st September to 31st March inclusive.

During this period, persons are authorised during the night either with or without artificial light to pursue rabbits or vermin on land in their own or their employer's occupation and on any other land with the consent and approval of the occupier, or if such consent and approval is unreasonably withheld, with the permission of the Governor. The name and address of each person proposing to pursue rabbits or vermin under the Order shall be furnished in writing in advance to the nearest Police Station by the occupier of the land.

The Game Order, 1950.

I, the said Lieutenant Governor, in exercise of the powers in me vested under the Game Amendment Act, 1942, DO hereby Order as follows:—

1.—The period of the year during which the powers under the Game Amendment Act, 1942, may be exercised will extend from the 1st September in each year to the 31st March following, both dates inclusive.

2.—Persons are hereby authorised during the aforesaid period during the night, either with or without artificial light, to pursue rabbits or vermin upon any land in the occupation of any such person or of his employer, and on any other land with the consent and approval of the occupier, or if such consent and approval is unreasonably withheld, with the permission in writing given by or on behalf of the Governor, provided that the name and address of each person proposing to pursue rabbits or vermin upon any land under the provisions of this Order shall be furnished in writing to the nearest Police Station by the occupier of such land before such rights are exercised such notice to cease to operate after the 31st March succeeding the date of giving such notice.

3.—The Order made by me on the 27th day of September, 1945, under the provisions of the Game Amendment Act, 1942, is hereby revoked.

4.—This Order may be cited as the Game Order, 1950.
