ISLE OF MAN POLICE (AMENDMENT) REGULATIONS 1950.

THE ISLE OF MAN POLICE (AMENDMENT) REGULATIONS 1950.

I the said Lieutenant Governor in pursuance of the powers vested in me hereby make the following Regulations:—

1.—(1) For paragraph (2) of Regulation 35 of the Isle of Man Police Regulations, 1949, there shall be substituted the following paragraph:—

“(2) Every member of the police force below the rank of superintendent who is required to do duty on a public holiday or on a day which would otherwise have been a weekly rest day shall be granted, if and as soon as the exigencies of duty permit, time off equal to one and a half times the period of completed hours of duty on each such day.”

(2) After paragraph (4) of the said Regulation there shall be added the following paragraph:—

“(5) For the purposes of this Regulation—

- (a) a member of the police force who is paid a detective duty allowance in respect of duty on a public holiday or on a day which would otherwise have been a weekly rest day shall only be deemed to be required to do duty on such a day if he has been specifically ordered to do duty;
- (b) a period of duty of less than two hours shall be treated as though it were a period of duty of two hours;
- (c) one day's pay shall be calculated at the weekly rate of pay divided by six, fractions of a penny being ignored;
- (d) a reference to a day which would otherwise have been a weekly rest day is to be construed as reference to a day which according to the roster of weekly rest days was to have been a weekly rest day for the member concerned and for the purpose of determining what would have been such a day under the roster any alteration in the roster made less than eight days before the day shall be ignored except where the alteration is made at the request of the member concerned.
- (e) a weekly rest day means a rest day for the purposes of Regulation 36 hereof.

2. For paragraph (3) of Regulation 45 of the said Regulations there shall be substituted the following paragraph:—

“(3) One day's pay shall be calculated for all purposes other than those of Regulation 35 at the weekly rate of pay divided by seven, fractions of a penny being ignored.”

3. For Regulation 50 of the said Regulations, there shall be substituted the following Regulation:—

“50.—(1) A member of the police force who in the opinion of the chief officer of police is required to move his home by the exigencies of police duty otherwise than on transfer from one force to another shall have his reasonably incurred removal expenses reimbursed or the police authority may carry out the removal.

- (2) Where as a result of such a move the member finds it necessary to incur expenditure on adapting or replacing existing household furnishings, he shall be entitled to receive from the police fund the sum of £5 and, if the expenditure actually and necessarily so incurred exceeds that amount, to receive, in addition to that amount, a further payment in reimbursement of the expenditure so incurred in so far as it exceeds that amount so, however, that such further payment shall in no case exceed the amount set out in the following Table opposite to the rank he holds :—

TABLE.

RANK	AMOUNT
Above the rank of Superintendent	£35
Superintendent	£25
Inspector	£20
Sergeant, Acting Sergeant, Constable	£15."

4.—(1) These Regulations may be cited as (The Isle of Man Police (Amendment) Regulations, 1950.

(2) These Regulations shall come into force on the 8th day of August, 1950.
