THE GOODS AND SERVICES (PRICE CONTROL) (No. 92) ORDER,  
1950.

---

His Excellency the Deputy Governor has made an Order under the Goods and Services (Price Control) Act, 1941, as extended to the Isle of Man by the Goods and Services (Price Control) (Isle of Man) Order, 1943, providing that the maximum prices and/or charges to be charged in the Isle of Man for

Utility Apparel

Furniture

Utility Cloth and Utility Household Textiles

shall be the same as those fixed by Orders made by the Board of Trade, and terminating the application in the Isle of Man of the Board of Trade Orders controlling the price of

Rubber Footwear

which now ceases to be price-controlled.

Three Orders made by His Excellency (Nos. 39, 54 and 58) have been revoked to correspond with revocations of Board of Trade Orders relating to Rubber Footwear.

The Order comes into force on the 31st day of August, 1950.

The new Board of Trade Orders concerned are specified in the First Schedule to the Order, a copy of which is appended.

The Utility Apparel (Maximum Prices and Charges) Order, 1949 (Amendment No. 9) Order, 1950, S.I. 1950 No. 1305 (price 1d.) amends the principal Order, as amended. It substitutes Related Schedule No. 3G (women's and maids' outerwear other than knitted apparel and gloves) (price 4d.) for Related Schedule No. 3F and Supplements Nos. 1, 2, 3 and 4 thereto; substitutes Related Schedule No. 5G (industrial overalls and aprons) (price 4d.) for Related Schedule No. 5F; brings into force Supplement No. 1 to Related Schedule No. 17 (women's domestic overalls and aprons) (price 3d.); and cancels Related Schedule No. 7C and Supplements thereto (infants' and girls' apparel other than knitted apparel and gloves). The maximum price of the last-mentioned goods is now to be computed by reference solely to the purchase price paid and the permitted margin.

The Furniture (Maximum Prices) (Amendment) Order, 1950, S.I. 1950 No. 1306 (price 1d.) amends the Furniture (Maximum Prices) Order, 1949, as follows:—

- (a) Related Schedule UF4 (price 4d.) is substituted for UF3.
- (b) In respect of new utility furniture, the maximum and overriding maximum prices, specified in Related Schedule UF4, are fixed by reference to the Type Symbol borne by the furniture instead of, as hitherto, by reference to the description of the furniture.
- (c) Provision is made for the upward rounding of distributors' maximum prices for new utility furniture to the nearest 3d.

The Utility Cloth and Utility Household Textiles (Maximum Prices) (Amendment No. 10) Order, 1950. S.I. 1950 No. 1308 (price id.) amends the principal Order, as amended, by providing that wholesalers' and retailers' maximum prices for utility woven wool apparel and pram rug cloth and woven wool pram rugs are now to be computed solely by reference to the purchase price and the permitted margin; the reference to Related Schedule No. 1J, which provides wholesalers' and retailers' overriding maximum prices for these goods, is now omitted from the Second Schedule to the principal Order. It provides that Items 1 and 2 of the Table of Margins in the First Schedule to the principal Order, which provided margins for certain subsidized woven wool cloth, shall be omitted; the permitted margins are now the same, therefore, for all utility woven wool cloth (14.28 per cent. for wholesalers and 33½ per cent. for retailers). The Order also brings into operation Supplement No. 1 to Related Schedule No. 5J (price id.) which provides wholesalers' and retailers' overriding maximum prices for utility household textiles.

The Orders set out in the First Schedule to the Order may be seen or purchased at the Office of the Secretary of the Price Regulation Committee, 1, Hope Street, Douglas, or may be seen at any Police Station on application to the Officer in Charge, at the Douglas Public Library, the Douglas Town Hall and the Offices of all the Town and Village Commissioners.

Failure to comply with the terms of the Orders renders a person liable to prosecution.

**THE GOODS AND SERVICES (MAXIMUM PRICES) (No. 92) ORDER,  
1950.**

WHEREAS the Board of Trade under the powers vested in them under the Goods and Services (Price Control) Act, 1941, have from time to time made Orders fixing the maximum prices and/or charges to be charged in the course of the businesses comprising the sale of goods and/or the performing of services in relation thereto, and requiring the keeping of records and the display of notices in respect of certain goods in the course of such businesses, and it is desirable that the prices and charges of such goods and services so fixed should be the maximum prices and charges to be charged and that such records should be kept and such notices displayed in respect of such businesses in the Isle of Man.

NOW I, the said Deputy Governor, by virtue of the powers conferred on me by Sections 1, 2 and 18 of the Goods and Services (Price Control) Act, 1941, as extended to the Isle of Man by the Goods and Services (Price Control) (Isle of Man) Order in Council, 1943, and all other powers and authorities me in this behalf enabling. DO HEREBY ORDER as follows :—

1. The maximum prices and charges to be charged, the records to be kept, and the notices to be displayed in the course of the businesses dealt with by the Orders of the Board of Trade set out in the First Schedule hereto, and in relation to the goods referred to in such Orders, ascertained in the manner specified in such Orders (the Orders being read together with any repeals, amendments or variations), shall be the maximum prices and charges which may be charged, the records which shall be kept, and the notices which shall be displayed in respect of such businesses and in relation to such goods in this Island.

2. The Orders set out in the Second Schedule hereto are hereby revoked.

3. This Order may be cited as "The Goods and Services (Maximum Prices) (No. 92) Order, 1950" and shall come into force on the 31st day of August, 1950.
