CUSTOMS (ISLE OF MAN) (No. 2)
ORDER, 1960.

WHEREAS it appears to me to be expedient for the purpose of making duties of customs in the Isle of Man conform to the duties of customs in the United Kingdom to make the following Order :

NOW THEREFORE I, the said Deputy Governor. by virtue of the powers conferred on me by Section 2 of the Customs (Isle of Man) Act, 1958, and all other powers enabling me in that behalf DO hereby make the following Order :

1. Subsection (3) of Section 5 of the Isle of Man (Customs) Act, 1949 (definition of "mechanical lighters") shall be amended by the substitution, for the words from "means" to the end, of the words "means any portable contrivance intended to provide a means of ignition whether by spark, flame or otherwise, being a mechanical, chemical, electrical or similar contrivance".
2. The duties chargeable on playing cards under Section 15 of the Isle of Man (Customs) Act, 1926, as continued in force by the Isle of Man (Customs) Resolution, 1958, shall cease to be chargeable.
3. This Order shall be deemed to have had effect from the fourth day of August, nineteen hundred and sixty.
4. This Order may be cited as the Customs (Isle of Man) (No. 2) Order, 1960.
5. The Interpretation Act, 1949, shall apply to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Tynwald.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Order but is intended to indicate its general purport)

This Order amends with effect from 4th August 1960 the definition of mechanical lighters for the purposes of duties of customs and abolishes the duties chargeable on playing cards to correspond with the amendments made in the United Kingdom by the Finance Act 1960.
